SUBJECT: Approval of the Use of AB 879 Funding to Purchase
Live-Scan Devices for the County Probation Department

RECOMMENDED MOTION: Move that the Board of Supervisors approve and direct the Auditor-Controller to make the budget adjustments on the attached Schedule A.

BACKGROUND: County Probation needs to purchase three live-scan devices to meet the requirements of Proposition 69, the DNA, Fingerprint, Unsolved Crime and Innocence Protection Act, and a portable live-scan to be used exclusively for the Department's pre-employment background checks.

On August 25, 2005, the Riverside CAL-ID Remote Access Network Board approved the use of AB 879 funds to purchase two live-scan devices for County Probation. County Probation will purchase the other two through CAL-ID with funding from its own budget (See Attachment B).

II. OLD BUSINESS

A. PAST BOARD MEETING MINUTES:

The Board reviewed the minutes of the March 3, 2005, meeting. Sheriff Doyle asked the members if any corrections or revisions were needed. All being in order, a motion was made to approve the minutes:

III. CAL-ID STAFF REPORTS

A. TEN PRINT OPERATIONS:

Staff reported ten print operations processed 34,362 cards from 1-1-05 to 6-30-05, which is an average of 5,727 cards per month. Staff also reported the unit received 501 case submissions, or an average of 83 per month. These numbers, when compared to the same time period last year, represent an increase of 8 ten print case submissions.

An average of 60% of the cards per month required human intervention (either pattern typing/core placement or Hit/No Hit verifications). Human intervention is required to allow the Live-Scan submissions to flow through the system to the Department of Justice.

CAL-ID reports a 52% hit rate during the current time period. Upon completion of local processing, live-scan transactions are electronically forwarded to CAL-DOJ.

B. LIVE-SCAN STATUS REPORT:

From 1-1-05 through 6-30-05, CAL-ID processed 35,356 fingerprint cards in the county. This represents a 99% capture rate through live scan devices.

Staff reported there are now 44 operating live-scan devices and three card scanners operating in the CAL-ID network. Most are working in dual environments of Criminal and Applicant processing.

Live Scan Requests (Probation-Prop 69)

Staff received a request from Riverside County Probation for the purchase of four live scan devices. They are requesting CAL-ID pay for the purchase of two palm live scans and they will purchase a palm and a tabletop device through CAL-ID (bulk pricing break) and reimburse CAL-ID through a Journal Entry (JE) budget transfer. It is requested all four

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devices remain under the CAL-ID maintenance agreement umbrella for consistency and accountability.

As a result of Proposition 69, Probation has a backlog of 28,000 felons to palm print. They are pushing to print those probationers who are due to be released from probation. The Probation Department is also required to positively identify probationers prior to submitting DNA samples.

Chief Henry asked if this would cause a duplicate print from probation. Lt. Feltenberger informed the board that it could result in multiple prints, but many were on probation prior to palm prints.

The Probation Department recently purchased manual palm ink rolling devices and received training from CAL-ID on rolling prints. Once the palm-prints are inked onto cards, they must be scanned into the CAPPS database at DOJ. As of this date, the registrant type of transaction (TOT) has not been instituted by DOJ and felons live-scanned by probation will not be transmitted electronically to DOJ. However, the live scan images can be printed onto cards and later scanned into the database by DOJ. The registrant TOT is expected to be instituted by DOJ in the next six months. Staff will update the RAN Board on the progress at the next meeting.

A motion was made to approve the purchase of four live scan devices for the Probation Department.

Live Scan Replacements

During fiscal year 05/06, eleven CAL-ID live scan sites will house equipment that have reached their end of life cycles and will no longer be supported under a maintenance agreement. The current yearly maintenance costs on the existing equipment is very high due to the older operating systems they run on. Replacing these eleven older live scans with newer models will result in \$14,488 annual maintenance agreement savings.

Sheriff asked if the current machines will have reached their life expectancy. Lt. Feltenberger informed the board that they have.
