SUBJECT: Modifications to Agreements with EDAW Concerning Consulting Services for Proposed Riverside County State Vehicular Recreational Area

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors approve the following and authorize the Board Chairman to execute same:

- 1) Consent to Assignment of Consulting Services Pertaining to Phase 2 of a Potential Off-Highway Highway Vehicle Park (Attachment 1);
- 2) Consent to Assignment of Consulting Services Pertaining to Phase 3 of a Potential Off-Highway Highway Vehicle Park (Attachment 2);

BACKGROUND:

The County has two separate consulting services agreements with the firm EDAW for work performed in conjunction with Phase 2 and Phase 3 of the State Vehicular Recreation Area (SVRA) in the Badlands area of Riverside County. Although the County manages these contracts, funding is provided by State Parks.

EDAW recently advised County staff of a corporate merger with AECOM Technology Corporation (AECOM). While EDAW will maintain their identity, culture, and relationships with
