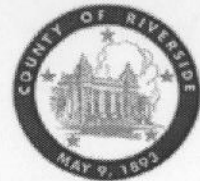

SUBJECT: Agreement between County of Riverside Waste Management Department and Hilton, Farnkopf & Hobson to Provide Solid Waste Consulting Services

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board:

1. Approve the Agreement between the County of Riverside Waste Management Department (WMD) and Hilton, Farnkopf & Hobson (HF&H) to provide solid waste consulting services; and
2. Authorize the Chairman to execute the Agreement on behalf of the Board.

BACKGROUND: In 1992, the WMD executed the Fifth Amendment to the El Sobrante Landfill Agreement, which allowed for the import of out-of-county waste into the landfill. In 1998, the County entered into the Second El Sobrante Landfill Agreement with Waste Management, Inc. (WMI), outlining the terms and conditions of a large expansion project at the landfill. A significant contract tonnage threshold has been reached since the effective date of that Agreement pertaining to the fee that the County pays WMI to landfill County trash. The contract tonnage threshold invokes a rate setting mechanism that ensures the County will not pay more than any other jurisdiction whose waste is deposited at El Sobrante. A small (\$12,500) professional services contract with HF&H was executed by the Waste Management Department in 2004 to help develop an audit strategy to confirm the lowest import rate. Discussions with WMI are in process, and WMD recommends that additional studies in the amount of \$75,000 be performed to provide a 10 to 15 year outlook assessment of regional solid waste market conditions.

The attached agreement outlines the scope of work and time frame presented by HF&H to accomplish the study.
