RECOMMENDED MOTION: **APPROVE** the Cooperative Agreement between the County of Riverside, The Riverside County Flood Control and Water Conservation District, (District) and the City of Corona (City); and **AUTHORIZE** the Chairman to execute the Agreement documents on behalf of the County.

BACKGROUND: The Agreement sets forth the terms and conditions by which the Corona Drains Line 46, Stage 1 storm drain is to be constructed by the District in association with the construction of certain street improvements along Magnolia Avenue and along Temescal Street proposed by the City of Corona.

The County is granting the District necessary rights to construct, operate and maintain the project within County road right-of-way.
