**SUBJECT:** Acceptance of Grant Award from the Department of Health and Human Services, Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA).

**RECOMMENDED MOTION:** Move that the Board of Supervisors:

- 1) Authorize the Chairperson to accept, on behalf of the Board, a \$245,516.00 grant award from HRSA - for design costs only - for the proposed expansion of the Trauma Center at Riverside County Regional Medical Center (RCRMC);
- 2) Approve and direct the Auditor-Controller to make the budget adjustments on the attached Schedule A.

**BACKGROUND:** RCRMC is the only Level II Trauma Center in Riverside County and handles approximately 47% of all traumas in the county. RCRMC has a mass decontamination unit that is capable of handling up to 150 people per hour for chemical, biological, or nuclear exposure. RCRMC is fully compliant with California's seismic safety regulation. Therefore, in the event of any type of major emergency or disaster situation, RCRMC would be the hospital of first response.

**BACKGROUND (Continued):**

RCRMC's Emergency Department is well sized, however the Trauma Center is extremely undersized. With trauma volume at the medical center exceeding expectations, one trauma room is not sufficient and too small to accommodate modern equipment and technology being used.

RCRMC has received this HRSA Grant to allow the medical center to design an expansion of the Trauma Center, and enabling RCRMC to fulfill their role as a hospital of first response for emergency, trauma, and disaster response for Riverside County.
