SUBJECT: Local Government Waste Tire Cleanup and Amnesty Event Grant

RECOMMENDED MOTION:

Adopt Resolution 2006-055 authorizing the Waste Management Department to submit applications to the California Integrated Waste Management Board for all available grants under the Waste Tire Recycling Management Program for the period of 2006 through 2011.

BACKGROUND: Public Resources Code Section 42889 authorizes the California Integrated Waste Management Board (CIWMB) to expend funds from the California Tire Recycling Management Fund (Tire Fund) to pay for the cost of tire collection, cleanup, abatement, or other remedial actions related to the disposal of waste tires. The CIWMB has allocated two million dollars (\$2,000,000) from the Tire Fund for the Fiscal Year 2005/2006 Local Government Waste Tire Cleanup and Amnesty Event Grant Program, which will have a cycle that will begin upon award of the monies and will end on June 30, 2007. BACKGROUND: *(Continued)*

The Waste Management Department (WMD) is seeking approval by the Board of Supervisors to apply for these grant funds from the CIWMB for the period of 2006 through 2011, as grant funds are available. Any grant funds awarded will be used to conduct collection and recycling of waste tires at Amnesty Day Events and to develop and distribute educational information to local residents and community groups. For Fiscal Year 2006/07, WMD is proposing to conduct ten Amnesty Events, focusing on the communities of Mecca, Mead Valley and Anza. It is estimated that in Fiscal Year 2006/07 the WMD will incur \$16,800 in costs to conduct the tire amnesty events. Approximately \$6,300 will be spent on staff time, \$500 on supplies, and another \$10,000 spent on the development of public education materials. WMD staff costs and the costs of developing or purchasing public education materials are ineligible for reimbursement from grant funding. These costs can be covered by WMD disposal fees.

The WMD has received Tire Amnesty Event funding from two previous grant cycles. The collection events have been positively received by the communities served, offer a cost-effective way for residents to properly recycle unwanted tires and help conserve landfill space.
