**RE:** Response to Annual Local Detention Facility Inspection Reports 2005

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The following outlines the status of the "out of compliance" items noted in the 2005 Environmental Health Evaluation, Nutritional Health Evaluation and Medical / Mental Health Evaluation Reports. This summary only covers facilities under the control of the Sheriff.

Banning Court Holding

**Environmental:** Ripped or torn mattresses have been replaced. This issue is ongoing and mattresses are replaced as needed.

Blythe Superior Court

**Environmental:** Procedures for Cleaning and Maintenance have been added to the Policy and Procedure Manual. A copy of the manual is available on site.

**Medical/Mental Health:** Policy and Procedures are currently being developed to address the issues outlined by the inspectors

Blythe Jail

**Environmental:** Items identified have been repaired.

**Nutritional:** Policy and Procedure revisions are currently under administrative review for approval. New food trays have been purchased. Food is covered and proper temperatures are maintained.

Indio Jail

**Environmental:** Items identified have been repaired.

Nutritional: Policy and Procedure revisions are currently under administrative review for approval.

Medical/Mental Health: Comments have been forwarded to Detention Health Services for review and correction.

Larsen Justice Center

Environmental: Procedures for Cleaning and Maintenance have been added to the Policy and Procedure Manual.

Medical/Mental Health: Policy and Procedures are currently being developed to address the issues outlined by the inspectors

Smith Correctional Facility

Environmental: Items identified have been repaired.

Nutritional: A Registered Dietician is currently assisting with planning and providing therapeutic diets. The inspector noted this item was corrected from 2004 report.

Medical/Mental Health: Comments have been forwarded to Detention Health Services for review and correction.

Robert Presley Detention Center

Environmental: All mattresses with ripped or missing covers have been replaced. All other items have been repaired.

Nutritional: Policy and Procedure revisions are currently under administrative review for approval.

Southwest Detention Center

Environmental: Ripped or torn mattresses have been replaced. This issue is ongoing and mattresses are replaced as needed. Items identified have been repaired.

Nutritional: Supervisors have received accredited food safety certification. Policy and Procedure revisions are currently under administrative review for approval.

Here are the responses you requested regarding the inspections in the juvenile facilities.

### **Indio Juvenile Hall,**

Inspected April 20, 2005

All the deficiencies noted on page 5 of the environmental health section have been corrected. The item noted on page 1 of the California Uniform Retail Food Facilities Law section, the dietary house manager certification, will be renewed on March 28. The maintenance at the swimming pool has been brought to standard. The Department is currently addressing the deficiencies noted on page 4 of the nutrition section by obtaining a contract with a registered dietitian.

### **Riverside Juvenile Hall,**

Inspected April 6, 2005

All the deficiencies noted on page 5 of the environmental health section have been corrected. The items noted on page 1 of the California Uniform Retail Food Facilities Law section, the food safety and manager certification will be completed by March 28. The section 114015, repainting the floor of the walk – in is in process and all other items noted on page 1-2 have been completed. The item on page 3, food services plan is being completed. The department is currently addressing the deficiencies noted on page 4 by obtaining a contract with a registered dietitian.

### **Southwest Juvenile Hall,**

Inspected May 10, 2005

The deficiency noted on page 5 of the environmental health section has been corrected. The item noted on page 1 of the California Uniform Retail Food Facilities Law section, the food

safety and manager certification has been completed as well as item 6. The HACCP item noted on page 2 is in process of being completed by the facility managers. The deficiencies noted in the nutritional health evaluation have been corrected with the exception of the contract with a registered dietitian, which is being addressed at the department level, as noted above.

**Twin Pines Ranch,**

Inspected April 28, 2005

The deficiencies noted on page 5 of the environmental health section have all been corrected. All items noted in the health and safety section have been corrected with the exception of the new floor in the dining room which is currently in process. The swimming pool is closed in the winter months and will meet inspection requirements when it reopens. The items noted in the nutritional evaluation have been corrected with the exception of the registered dietitian. That item is being addressed by the Department as noted above.

**Van Horn Youth Center,**

Inspected April 6, 2005

The deficiency noted on page 5 of the environmental health section has been corrected. All items noted in the health and safety section have been corrected.

## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY OF DETENTION FACILITY INSPECTION 2005

**Environmental.** Overall, the facilities corrected the discrepancies noted last year, except for a few minor structural problems. As usual, new discrepancies occurred due to usage and age of fixtures and some inmate induced problems, none of which were serious. The only potential areas of concern in the kitchens were a finding of food being stored or held out of the required temperature range in several detention facilities, and one with an inadequate high temperature dishwasher. Both conditions can increase the risk of food-borne illness. It should be noted that many Food Service Supervisor's accredited food safety certificates had expired.

**Nutrition** This year, the adult Type II & III facilities have corrected all of the areas they were out of compliance in over the last few years related to securing the services of a Registered Dietitian (RD) for regular menu review, approval, and development of therapeutic menus. In addition, the food service managers, Ms. Nash and Ms. Grey, have worked diligently over this past year to develop written policies & procedures related to food service requirements under Title 15. It should be noted that there were some areas of non-compliance noted at the Blythe Jail and at the Southwest County Justice Center related to 1243 Food Manager and 1247 Disciplinary Diet; however, by the time of the last site inspection, these deficiencies had been addressed. We recommend that these facilities continue to expand their Plan Policy & Procedures (P&P's) to make them site specific and address in more detail aspects of food service related to; 1) Safe food handling to include temperature checks and action to be taken when temperatures are off; 2) initial and on-going staff training in safe food handling; 3) emergency feeding plans; 4) communication and documentation of disciplinary and therapeutic diets prepared and served. In addition, we recommend they utilize the RD to develop a regular snack menu with appropriate revisions for various therapeutic diet orders and further define how the RD will be involved to address any therapeutic diet orders that are not already in place with a menu for the kitchen to follow.

For Juvenile Halls, areas of non-compliance continue to be related to not utilizing the services of a consulting Registered Dietitian for items addressed in the Menu section, the Minimum Diet section, and the Therapeutic Diet section, as required by Title 15. In addition, these same facilities are out of compliance again this year due to incomplete or non-existing policies, procedures and/or food service plan, with the exception of the Indio Juvenile Hall whose House Manager took the initiative this year to develop a P&P manual for the kitchen.

There were no violations found in Court Holding or Temporary Holding facilities regarding nutrition. However, it is recommended that Court Holding facilities create a written food service plan designating responsibility for food service even though the facility itself may not prepare and serve the food.

**Medical/Mental Health.** The county detention facilities have corrected most of their deficiencies and continue to be current with their procedures and other regulation requirements. There is one county facility that has several approved waivers from the Board of Corrections in place. One city jail that had continued to be in non-compliance for several years with the policies for health/mental health corrected this deficiency August of 2004, and is now in compliance.

An attached "Report Card" summarizes violations and corrections during the past year.

### **BACKGROUND AND ACTION**

As mandated by California Health and Safety Code, Section 10145, local detention facilities must be inspected annually by County Health Officer or local health departments (Riverside County Community Health Agency, Department of Public Health). The Department of Public Health has determined that the most efficient method is to conduct "team inspections" of each facility. The inspection team includes a Registered Environmental Health Specialist, (REHS), a Public Health Nurse, and a Nutritionist. This annual re-inspection method is consistent with the established interdepartmental written protocol.

Each facility manager has been issued a copy of his respective report(s). This executive summary along with the abridged inspection report and individual reports has been forwarded to the California Department of Corrections as specified in California Health and Safety Code, Section 10145 for their review.

## ABRIDGED INSPECTION REPORT 2005\*

### JUVENILE DETENTION FACILITIES

#### INDIO JUVENILE HALL

##### *Environmental:*

3 violations were noted during the previous annual inspection and all except one were corrected. During this inspection four different violations were noted:

1. Food Service Supervisor's accredited food safety certificate expired.

##### *Nutrition:*

##### **Areas of Non-Compliance:**

1462 Therapeutic Diets: Not utilizing a Registered Dietitian (RD) to review and approve therapeutic diet menus already written.

1462 Therapeutic Diets: Diet Manual not reviewed by RD

1463 Menus: Not utilizing RD to review and approve menus prior to implementation.

##### *Medical/Mental Health:*

No deficiencies. Minors were treated with personalized care by both the physician and nurses observed during sick call and passing of medications.

## RIVERSIDE JUVENILE HALL

### *Environmental:*

Eight violations were noted during previous annual inspection and all but two violations were corrected. During this inspection eleven different violations were noted:

1. Food Service Supervisor's accredited food safety certificate expired.
2. Store raw-meat below fresh produce to prevent contamination.
3. Seal walk-in and dry storage floor or replace.
4. No test strips were on site to use for testing. Provide test strips for manual sanitation.
5. Store scoops with handles up in bulk containers so as to be protected from contamination.
6. Cleaning Solution improperly labeled and stored.
7. Air gap insufficient between floor sink and drainage lines of the ice makes.

### *Nutrition:*

#### **Areas of Non-Compliance**

1461 Minimum Diet: 1) Not meeting requirement for a third serving of protein from dried beans or legumes per week. 2) Also, not meeting requirement for Vitamin C.

1462 Therapeutic Diets: Not utilizing RD to assist with planning and providing therapeutic diets. Without RD consultation, facility manager does not have adequate resources (therapeutic diet menus) to ensure compliance. RD did not sign diet manual.

1463 Menus: Not utilizing RD to review and approve menus prior to implementation, or to approve menu changes annually.

1464 Food Service Manager: Food Service Plan Policy & Procedures still in process.

### *Medical/Mental Health:*

Medical staff shortage continues to be a challenge. Policies and procedures have been revised and kept organized.

## SOUTHWEST JUVENILE HALL

### *Environmental:*

*Eight* violations were noted during previous annual inspection all were corrected. During this inspection four different violations were noted:

1. Food Service Supervisor's accredited food safety certificate expired.
2. Must provide Hazard Analysis Critical Control Plan (HACCP)
3. No test strips were on site to use for testing. Provide test strips for manual sanitation.

### *Nutrition:*

1461 Minimum Diet: Has improved total number servings of grains to meet Title 15 requirements but, still not meeting requirement for providing at least three servings of whole or partially whole grains/day. Not meeting requirement for a third serving of protein from dried beans or legumes per week.

1462 Therapeutic Diets: Not utilizing RD to assist with planning and providing therapeutic diets. Without RD consultation, facility manager does not have adequate resources (therapeutic diet menus) to ensure compliance.

1463 Menus: Not utilizing RD to review and approve menus prior to implementation, or to approve menu changes annually.

1464 Food Service Manager Not meeting requirement for Written Food Service Plan. Verbal report only was given.

### *Medical/Mental Health:*

No deficiencies. The facility continues to be a very therapeutic environment for the minors.

## TWIN PINES RANCH

### *Environmental:*

Nine violations were noted during previous annual inspection and all but two were corrected. During this inspection eight different violations were noted:

1. Meat items should not be store below non-meat products.
2. Damaged seal on door of walk in refrigerator.
3. Clean debris in walk in refrigerator against wall.
4. Dining room flooring is in poor condition and needs to be replaced. Floor underneath grill needs to be cleaned.
5. Bulk containers need to be labeled.
6. Requirements for manual sanitation and cleaning and sanitizing of utensils and equipments not met.
7. Air gap insufficient between floor sink and drainage lines of the ice makes.

### *Nutrition:*

#### **Areas of Non Compliance:**

1461 Minimum Diet: Not in compliance with limiting total fat to thirty percent of calories or less for the third year now. Also, not meeting requirement for third serving of legumes three times a week.

1463 Menus: Not utilizing RD to review and approve menus prior to implementation, or to approve menu changes annually.

1464 Food Service Manager: Not meeting requirement for written Food Service Plan.

### *Medical/Mental Health:*

No deficiencies. There needs to be a process in place for monitoring when CPR renewals are needed for staff. Would be helpful to work with Probation to obtain the Health and Education Passports on those minors in foster care.

## VAN HORN YOUTH CENTER

### *Environmental:*

4 violations were noted during previous annual inspection and all had been corrected. During this inspection three minor different violations were noted.

1. Store raw-meat below fresh produce to prevent contamination.
2. Clean underneath kitchen counter.
3. Air gap insufficient between floor sink and drainage lines of the ice maker.

### *Nutrition:*

#### **Areas of Non Compliance:**

1461 Minimum Diet: 1) Not meeting requirement for a third serving of protein from dried beans or legumes per week; 2) Not meeting requirement for Vitamin C.

1462 Therapeutic Diets: Not utilizing RD to assist with planning and providing therapeutic diets. Without RD consultation, facility manager does not have adequate resources (therapeutic diet menus) to ensure compliance.

Diet manual not signed.

1463 Menus: Not utilizing RD to review and approve menus prior to implementation, or to approve menu changes annually.

1464 Food Service Manager: Not meeting requirement for Written Food Service Plan.

### *Medical/Mental Health:*

No deficiencies. Minors can access health care daily.

## **ADULT DETENTION FACILITIES**

### **BANNING COURT HOLDING**

#### *Environmental:*

Remove and replace any ripped mattresses.

#### *Nutrition:*

No deficiencies.

#### *Medical/Mental Health:*

No deficiencies. This facility meets the requirements as a court holding facility.

### **BLYTHE BRANCH COURT**

#### *Environmental:*

During this inspection four minor maintenance problems were noted.

#### *Nutrition:*

#### Recommendation:

1243 Food Manager: Recommend a written procedure designating responsibility for food service and how any emergency situations related to food/fluids will be addressed.

#### *Medical/Mental Health:*

No policy /procedure manual was at this facility. Attempts to contact the Deputy to confirm that the manual was placed there from Indio Jail, were to no avail. The policy and procedure manual should be available for use at this facility.

### **BLYTHE JAIL**

#### *Environmental:*

Four violations were noted during previous annual inspection and were corrected. During this inspection four different minor structural maintenance problems were noted.

*Nutrition:*

**Areas of Non-Compliance:**

1240 Frequency of Serving: Need to develop snack menu for each therapeutic diet

1243 Food Manager: Need Emergency Feeding Plan

**Recommendations:**

- 1) Cover Trays before transporting
- 2) Expand all existing P&P's to more specifically address Title 15 items under the Food Manager, Disciplinary Diets and Therapeutic Diets

*Medical/Mental Health:*

No deficiencies at this facility. New blood pressure equipment and thermometers were obtained after 2004 inspection. Waiver exists for size of medical exam room and size of confidential interview room, as jail was built prior to 2-1-99.

CATHEDRAL CITY JAIL

*Environmental:*

1. During this inspection one minor structural maintenance problem was noted.

*Nutrition:*

**Recommendation:**

1243 Food Manager: Need to add a front cover page to the P&P Manual for signatures and dates that indicates annual internal review and references to any revision and addition to the P & P manual is yet to be implemented.

*Medical/Mental Health:*

No deficiencies. This facility meets the minimum requirements as described in Title 15 regulations for medical/mental health.

CORONA CITY JAIL

*Environmental:*

1. During this inspection one minor structural maintenance problem was noted.

*Nutrition:*

Recommendation:

1243 Food Manager:

A written food service plan that addresses all aspects of food service and designates responsibility for each aspect must be in place to be in compliance

*Medical/Mental Health:*

As of August 26, 2004, the Health Care Policy has been updated.

Recommendation that the First Aid Kits be updated with new items and expiration dates be monitored in the items located inside the kits.

DESERT HOT SPRINGS CITY JAIL

*Environmental:*

During this inspection there were two minor violations.

*Nutrition:*

Recommendation:

1243 Food Manager: Annual review of P&P manual w/ signature and date of review recorded on cover page.

*Medical/Mental Health:*

No deficiencies. This facility continues to undergo personnel changes.

HEMET CITY JAIL

*Environmental:*

No deficiencies.

*Nutrition:*

No deficiencies.

*Medical/Mental Health:*

This facility continues with several minor deficiencies that were seen from the 2004 inspection. Recommendation was given to revise the sobering cell policy to include more detail in handling both male and female inmates (i.e. privacy issues, etc.). Need a better system for monitoring the first aid kits and a process for replacing expired or missing items and for periodic inspection of the kit. The health - screening tool does not address mental health issues and developmental disabilities.

HEMET BRANCH COURT - The facility is not currently being used.

*Environmental:*

During this inspection there were three minor violations.

*Nutrition:*

No violations.

*Medical/Mental Health:*

This facility is currently not being used and has not been for several years. There are no policies/procedures on site to review. If this facility is again operational, the policy/procedure manuals need to be on site for staff to reference.

INDIO JAIL

*Environmental:*

During this inspection there was 1 minor violation.

*Nutrition:*

Recommendations:

1243 Food Manager: Continue to expand P&P's to specifically address all items under Title 15 related to food service. In particular, P&P's related to safe handling of food and temperature checks, staff training, communication and documentation related to disciplinary and therapeutic diets.

1248 Therapeutic Diets: Recommend development of a snack menu that indicates revisions as appropriate for various therapeutic diets.

*Medical/Mental Health:*

The Pharmaceutical Management section needs to include a statement regarding self-medication and the secure storage of prescribed medication when it is on the inmate's person. Also needs to make a provision regarding the consistent enforcement of self-medication rules by both custody and health care staff.

INDIO LARSEN JUSTICE CENTER

*Environmental:*

During this inspection there was one minor violation.

1. Develop written policies and procedures for maintenance staff.

*Nutrition:*

Recommendation:

1243 Food Manager: As stated in 2004, it is recommended this facility have a food service plan in writing that clearly states who is responsible for food service, how and where food is served and any special needs related to food service, such as fluid restrictions, emergency feeding plan, etc.

*Medical/Mental Health:*

No change since 2004 inspection. There continues to be no medical/mental health procedures or policies available for review at this facility. The Indio jail procedures can be obtained for use at this facility, but a separate copy needs to be available to staff at this court holding facility.

## LARRY D. SMITH CORRECTIONAL FACILITY

### *Environmental:*

During this inspection three violations were noted and a month later all items were corrected:

1. Clean cake mixer.
2. A majority of the violations were minor plumbing and structural repairs that were noted in the report.

### *Nutrition:*

1242 Menus: Not utilizing RD to review and approve menus prior to implementation, or to approve menu changes annually.

1248 Therapeutic Diets: Not utilizing RD to assist with planning and providing therapeutic diets. Without RD consultation, facility manager does not have adequate resources (therapeutic diet menus) to ensure compliance. RD did not sign diet manual.

### *Medical/Mental Health:*

The policy needs to reflect the new medical history form being used. A policy needs to be created to cover Standard 1209 when Transferring to a Treatment Facility (no mention of this in the adult section, only in the juvenile section). The policy on first aid kits needs to be revised to include the number, location and procedure for periodic review of the kits.

## PALM SPRINGS CITY JAIL

### *Environmental:*

No deficiencies.

### *Nutrition:*

#### Recommendations:

Policy & Procedure manual should include a cover page that has a place for signature and dates to be used for any procedure updates, etc. P&P manual should be reviewed annually. Last reviewed in 2004 per signature.

*Medical/Mental Health:*

No deficiencies at this facility. Recommendation was given to add a list of contents in first aid kit and also to follow the frequency of inspections according to policy.

RIVERSIDE SUPERIOR COURTS FAMILY LAW COURT HOLDING FACILITY

*Environmental:*

No deficiencies.

*Nutrition:*

Recommendations:

1243 Food Manager: Need a written procedure to address Food Manager Section 1243 indicating that food is not served in the facility. Detainees are fed prior to and after being held for court proceedings.

*Medical/Mental Health:*

This facility now has a written suicide prevention policy in place.

RIVERSIDE HALL OF JUSTICE

*Environmental:*

No deficiencies.

*Nutrition:*

Recommendation:

1243 Food Manager: Recommend a written food service plan addressing responsibility for regular food service and how any emergency situations regarding food/fluid will be handled.

*Medical/Mental Health:*

This facility now has a written suicide prevention policy in place.

## ROBERT PRESLEY DETENTION CENTER

### *Environmental:*

During this inspection 4 violations were noted:

1. Insufficient air gap between floor trap and refrigerator condensation line.
2. Major structural and plumbing repairs are needed in both old and new jails.

### *Nutrition:*

#### Recommendations:

1243 Food Manager: Continue to expand P&P's to specifically address all items under Title 15 related to food service. In particular, P&P's related to safe handling of food and temperature checks, staff training, communication and documentation related to disciplinary and therapeutic diets.

### *Medical/Mental Health:*

No deficiencies. This facility meets the minimum requirements as described in Title 15 regulations for medical/mental health.

## SOUTHWEST COUNTY DETENTION CENTER

### *Environmental:*

During this inspection six violations were noted.

1. Food Service Supervisor's accredited food safety certificate expired.
2. Hand washing sink next to the produce walk-in is in need of repair.
3. The high temperature dish machine did not reach at least 180°F water temperature on the final rinse.
4. No sanitizing test strips were present in the facility.
5. Insufficient air gap between floor sink and drainage lines of the ice machine.

*Nutrition:*

**Areas of Non-Compliance:**

1243 Food Manager: 1) Need to develop written procedure for safe food handling to include temperature checks and how inaccurate temperature levels are addressed; 2) Need written procedure for an emergency feeding plan

1247 Disciplinary Diet: Verbal report was given at the time of inspection that the diet is only served one times per day. Title 15 requires the diet be served two times per day. There is no written procedure that is site specific as to how the orders are communicated and how delivery of meal is documented.

**Recommendation:**

1248 Therapeutic Diets: Current agreement with RD should include time for on-going consultation regarding non formulary diet orders and potential menu changes as needed. Recommend creating a procedure to address how RD will communicate with kitchen staff to provide non formulary therapeutic diets when ordered.

*Medical/Mental Health:*

No deficiencies. A recommendation was given to include the Medical Director or his designee in the death review meetings, as the intent of this standard is to provide a high level of medical review in the case of an inmate death.

SOUTHWEST COUNTY MUNICIPAL COURT HOLDING

*Environmental:*

No deficiencies.

*Nutrition:*

**Recommendation:**

Recommend a written procedure addressing 1243 Food Manager indicating responsibility for food service and how any emergency situations related to food or drink might be handled while inmate is at this facility.

*Medical/Mental Health:*
