SUBJECT: FY05 Buffer Zone Protection Program Grant

RECOMMENDED MOTION: Move that the Board of Supervisors accept the second portion of the FY05 Buffer Zone Protection Program (BZPP) Grant award in the amount of \$242,500 on behalf of Riverside County;

BACKGROUND: On 3/14/06 (Item 3.10), the Board of Supervisors accepted the first portion of the Buffer Zone Protection Program (BZPP) grant award in the amount of \$145,500. As part of the Governor's Office of Homeland Security grant program, these funds will provide protective action BZPP equipment and management funding to protect and secure three of thirteen federal-identified critical infrastructure sites in Riverside County. BZPP is designed to reduce vulnerabilities to sites by extending the protected area around a site into the surrounding community and supporting the prevention and preparedness efforts of local law enforcement first responders. On March 22, 2006, Riverside County Operational Area received a second notification that releases five more of the thirteen sites and provides \$242,500 in additional grant protective action BZPP equipment and management funding. Riverside County Operational Area applied for and is receiving this pass through funding on behalf of the first responders in the Sheriff's Department, Cities of Riverside, Moreno Valley, Temecula and Palm Springs Police Departments. A total of eight sites have been released. Funding for the remaining five sites will be provided as they are released. In accordance with federal regulations, the names and addresses of the sites may not be disclosed to mitigate the threat risk from such disclosure.

BZPP provides a total of \$50,000 in funding per site which is inclusive of state and local administrative fees. After the State deducts its portion of the fees, each site receives \$48,500.
