From 1997 through 2003, the County utilized Local Law Enforcement Block Grant funds (LLEBG) to support Youth Accountability Teams. In 2003, funding was redirected to support a Fugitive Apprehension Detail (9/23/03, 9.2a-d). With the realignment of Federal Justice Program funding in 2005, LLEBG and Edward Byrne Memorial grants were eliminated and replaced with the Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) programs, wherein the Board accepted the 2005 grant of \$253,859 (8/23/05, 3.84). In contrast to LLEBG, there is no required local match. Awards are based upon population and the reports of Part 1 crimes to the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

The Sheriff's Department has been notified that the County's FY 2006 grant application has been approved in the amount of \$155,653. The grant project and budget period is from 10/01/05 through 09/30/09. Program funds will be used to continue the support of a Fugitive Apprehension Detail Sergeant and provide support to the District Attorney's Office continued prosecution of criminals. In contrast to the LLEBG program, JAG provides administrative funds equal to ten percent (10%) of the award which will be used to support a Staff Analyst in the Sheriff's Grants Unit. A portion of the Staff Analyst's time will be spent monitoring the project and reporting on progress and expenditures.

The grant documents have been approved as to form by County Counsel.
