SUBJECT: Adoption of Resolution No. 2006-140 and Multi-Year Authorization to Apply to the Governor's Office of Emergency Services for an Anti-Drug Abuse Enforcement Grant

RECOMMENDED MOTION: Move that the Board of Supervisors:

1. Authorize the Sheriff to submit a renewal grant application to the Governor's Office of Emergency Services and sign the resulting grant award agreement in the amount of \$486,952 for the period July 1, 2006 to June 30, 2007 to fund the Anti-Drug Abuse Enforcement Program.
2. Adopt Resolution No. 2006-140 authorizing the Sheriff to submit renewal grant applications through FY 2008-09.

BACKGROUND: At its regular meeting on June 3, 2003 (3.36), the Board authorized the Sheriff to submit renewal grant applications through FY 2005-06 under Resolution No. 2003-241 for the Office of Criminal Justice Planning (OCJP) Anti-Drug Abuse (ADA) Enforcement Grant Program.

Since 1993, annual grant awards from the ADA program, along with asset forfeiture monies, have funded the efforts of six interagency task forces that target offenses related to illegal drug activities and a program that facilitates early disposition of specific narcotics cases. is a cooperative effort that includes the Sheriff's Department, District Attorney's Office, Probation, Department of Public Social Services, Public Defender, state agencies and municipal police departments throughout the County.

The Sheriff is now requesting the Board to authorize submission of the FY 2006-07 ADA grant application for \$486,952, to the Governor's Office of Emergency Services. This Federal allocation is \$300,541 less than the current year's funding amount. No County match is required for this grant program. However, to maintain the current enforcement effort, the County narcotics task forces will have to draw a significant amount of their funding from asset forfeiture.

As specified in the proposed Resolution No. 2006-140, the Department is also requesting authorization for the Sheriff to submit applications and any necessary documentation for this grant program through FY 2008-09, on behalf of the County.

5 TO THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE OF EMERGENCY SERVICES FOR AN ANTI-DRUG
6 ABUSE PROGRAM FOR FISCAL YEARS 2006-07, 2007-08 AND 2008-09

7 WHEREAS, the County of Riverside Sheriff's Department desires to undertake a
8 certain project designated the Anti-Drug Abuse Program, to be funded in part from
9 funds made available through the Anti-Drug Abuse Program administered by the
10 Governor's Office of Emergency Services (hereafter referred to as OES).

11 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of the
12 County of Riverside, State of California, in a regular session assembled on this 2nd day
13 of May, 2006, that the Board authorizes the Sheriff of the County of Riverside to submit
14 grant proposals to OES for the fiscal years 2006-07, 2007-08 and 2008-09, and further
15 authorizes the Sheriff to sign and approve on behalf of the County of Riverside Board of
16 Supervisors any extensions or amendments thereof.

17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the applicant agrees to provide all matching
18 funds required for said project (including any amendment thereof) under the Program
19 and the funding terms and conditions of OES and that the cash match will be
20 appropriated as required.

21 IT IS AGREED that any liability arising out of the performance of this Grant
22 Award Agreement, including civil court actions for damages, shall be the responsibility
23 of the grant recipient and the authorizing agency. The State of California and OES
24 disclaim responsibility for any such liability.

25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that grant funds received hereunder shall not be
used to supplant expenditures controlled by this body.

1 IT IS ALSO AGREED that this award is not subject to hiring freezes.
