RECOMMENDED MOTION: Move that the Board of Supervisors accept the fourth and final portion of the FY05 Buffer Zone Protection Program (BZPP) Grant award in the amount of \$97,000 on behalf of Riverside County.


BACKGROUND: On 3/14/06 (Agenda 3.10), 4/18/06 (Agenda 3.10), and 5/16/06 (Agenda 3.12) the Board of Supervisors accepted the first three portions of the Governor's Office of Homeland Security, Buffer Zone Protection Program (BZPP) grant award totaling \$533,500. This grant provides protective action BZPP equipment and management funding to protect and secure federal-identified critical infrastructure and key resource sites in Riverside County. BZPP is designed to reduce vulnerabilities to sites by extending the protected area around a site into the surrounding community and supporting the prevention and preparedness efforts of local law enforcement first responders. 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Program

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On May 18, 2006, Riverside County Operational Area received a fourth notification that releases the final two of the thirteen sites and provides \$97,000 in additional grant protective action BZPP equipment and management funding. Riverside County Operational Area applied for and is receiving this pass through funding on behalf of the first responders in the Sheriff's Department, Cities of Riverside, Moreno Valley, Temecula and Palm Springs Police Departments. All thirteen sites have now been released and approved for spending. In accordance with federal regulations, the names and addresses of the sites may not be disclosed to mitigate the threat risk from such disclosure.

BZPP provides a total of \$50,000 in funding per site which is inclusive of state and local administrative fees. After the State deducts its portion of the fees, each site receives \$48,500.
