BACKGROUND: (Continued).

The Riverside County Community Health Agency Department of Public Health has been awarded funding in the amount of \$119,897 from the Riverside County Children and Families Commission to continue the Immunization Program throughout currently funded areas in Riverside County.

The Immunization program ensures that children in Riverside County are protected against vaccine-preventable diseases. The goal of this program is to raise and maintain immunization rates for children ages 2 months to 5 years and to ready them for school entrance.

The national recommendations are age-appropriate immunizations for polio, diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis, measles, mumps, rubella, hepatitis B, hepatitis A, chickenpox, Hemophilus influenza type B, and invasive pneumococcal disease. In collaboration with the WIC program the Immunization Program provides immunizations at four of the WIC sites.
