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BACKGROUND: Landscaping and Lighting Maintenance District No. 89-1-Consolidated (District) maintains and services 80 landscape strips throughout Riverside County. 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### Zone 1

For fiscal year 2006-07, there is no proposed increase in assessment for Zone 1 over the assessment levied in fiscal year 2005-06. The proposed assessment for fiscal year 2006-07 for Zone 1 of the District is \$178.52 per acre. The actual rate property owners pay is based on the parcel size and there are 112 parcels, 99 parcels have charges substantially less than \$100.00 and the average assessment to these parcels is \$55.62.

Zone 1 was formed 9 years ago and did not establish an inflation factor . The proposed budget for fiscal year 2006-07 is \$14,695.

### Zone 3

For fiscal year 2006-07, there is no proposed increase in assessment for Zone 3 over the assessment levied in fiscal year 2005-06. The proposed assessment for fiscal year 2006-07 for Zone 3 of the District is \$77.68 per parcel and there are 4,942 parcels.

Zone 3 was formed 8 years ago and did not establish an inflation factor. The proposed budget for fiscal year 2006-07 is \$383,887.

### Zone 4

For fiscal year 2006-07, there is a proposed two percent (2%) inflationary increase in the assessment for Zone 4 over the assessment levied in fiscal year 2005-06 and is consistent with ballot proposition approved by the qualified electors when establishing said zone. The proposed assessment for fiscal year 2006-07 for Zone 4 is based on an Equivalent Dwelling Unit (EDU) rate of \$25.85 per year as follows:

1 Single Family lot	=	1 EDU	=	\$ 25.85 per year
1 Multi-Family lot	=	0.7 EDU	=	\$ 18.10 per year
1 Commercial acre	=	8 EDUs	=	\$206.80 per year
1 Industrial acre	=	4 EDUs	=	\$103.40 per year
1,000 sq. ft. of Church building	=	0.5 EDUs	=	\$ 12.93 per year

Zone 4 was established 8 years ago with an assessment of \$22.96 per EDU per year. The proposed budget for fiscal year 2006-07 is \$179,488.

### Zone 5

For fiscal year 2006-07, there is a proposed two percent (2%) inflationary increase in the assessment for Zone 5 over the assessment levied in fiscal year 2005-06 and is consistent with ballot proposition approved by the qualified electors when establishing said zone. The proposed assessment for fiscal year 2006-07 for Zone 5 of the District is \$40.25 per parcel and there are 1,409 parcels.

Zone 5 was established 8 years ago with an assessment of \$34.35 per parcel per year. The proposed budget for fiscal year 2006-07 is \$56,717.

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### **Zone 6**

For fiscal year 2006-07, there is a proposed two percent (2%) inflationary increase in the assessment for Zone 6 over the assessment levied in fiscal year 2005-06 and is consistent with ballot proposition approved by the qualified electors when establishing said zone. The proposed assessment for fiscal year 2006-07 for Zone 6 of the District is \$184.13 per parcel and there are 30 parcels.

Zone 6 was established 7 years ago with an assessment of \$160.67 per parcel per year. The proposed budget for fiscal year 2006-07 is \$5,524.

### **Zone 7**

For fiscal year 2006-07, there is a proposed two (2%) inflationary increase in assessment for Zone 7 over the assessment levied in fiscal year 2005-06 and is consistent with ballot proposition approved by the qualified electors when establishing said zone. The proposed assessment for fiscal year 2006-07 for Zone 7 of the District is \$4.17 per acre. The actual rate property owners pay is based on the parcel size and there are 168 parcels, 140 parcels have charges substantially less than \$50.00 and the average assessment to these parcels is \$15.66.

Zone 7 was established 7 years ago with an assessment of \$3.64 per acre per year. The proposed budget for fiscal year 2006-07 is \$9,173.

### **Zone 8**

For fiscal year 2006-07, there is a proposed two percent (2%) inflationary increase in the assessment for Zone 8 over the assessment levied in fiscal year 2005-06 and is consistent with ballot proposition approved by the qualified electors when establishing said zone. The proposed assessment for fiscal year 2006-07 for Zone 8 is based on an Equivalent Dwelling Unit (EDU) rate of \$39.57 per year as follows:

1 Single Family lot	=	1 EDU	=	\$ 39.57 per year
1 Multi-Family lot	=	0.7 EDU	=	\$ 27.70 per year
1 Commercial acre	=	8 EDUs	=	\$316.56 per year
1 Industrial acre	=	4 EDUs	=	\$158.28 per year
1,000 sq. ft. of Church building	=	0.5 EDUs	=	\$ 19.79 per year

Additionally \$22,000 in Ad Valorem monies is provided to Zone 8 annually.

Zone 8 was established 6 years ago with an assessment of \$35.46 per EDU per year. The proposed budget for fiscal year 2006-07 is \$136,049.

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### **Zone 9**

For fiscal year 2006-07, there is a proposed two percent (2%) inflationary increase in the assessment for Zone 8 over the assessment levied in fiscal year 2005-06 and is consistent with ballot proposition approved by the qualified electors when establishing said zone. The proposed assessment for fiscal year 2006-07 for Zone 9 of the District is \$35.28 per parcel and there are 493 parcels.

Zone 9 was established 6 years ago with an assessment of \$32.00 per parcel per year. The proposed budget for fiscal year 2006-07 is \$17,395.

### **Zone 10**

For fiscal year 2006-07, there is no proposed increase in the assessment for Zone 10 over the assessment levied in fiscal year 2005-06. The proposed assessment for fiscal year 2006-07 for Zone 10 of the District is \$321.32 per acre. The actual rate property owners pay is based on the parcel size and there are 26 parcels.

Zone 10 was established 5 years ago with an assessment of \$321.32 per acre per year. The proposed budget for fiscal year 2006-07 is \$24,050.

### **Zone 11**

For fiscal year 2006-07, there is no proposed increase in the assessment for Zone 11 over the assessment levied in fiscal year 2005-06. The proposed assessment for fiscal year 2006-07 for Zone 11 of the District is \$109.00 per parcel and there are 243 parcels.

Zone 11 was established 2 years ago with an assessment of \$109.00 per parcel per year. The proposed budget for fiscal year 2006-07 is \$26,487.

### **Zone 14**

For fiscal year 2006-07, there is a proposed two percent (2%) inflationary increase in the assessment for Zone 14 over the assessment levied in fiscal year 2005-06 and is consistent with ballot proposition approved by the qualified electors when establishing said zone. The proposed assessment for fiscal year 2006-07 for Zone 14 is based on an Equivalent Dwelling Unit (EDU) rate of \$45.50 per year as follows:

1 Single Family lot	=	1 EDU	=	\$ 45.50 per year
1 Multi-Family lot	=	0.7 EDU	=	\$ 31.85 per year
1 Commercial acre	=	8 EDUs	=	\$364.00 per year
1 Industrial acre	=	4 EDUs	=	\$182.00 per year
1,000 sq. ft. of Church building	=	0.5 EDUs	=	\$ 22.75 per year

Zone 14 was established 4 years ago with an assessment of \$44.60 per EDU per year. The proposed budget for fiscal year 2006-07 is \$55,957.

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### **Zone 15**

For fiscal year 2006-07, there is a proposed two percent (2%) inflationary increase in the assessment for Zone 15 over the assessment levied in fiscal year 2005-06 and is consistent with ballot proposition approved by the qualified electors when establishing said zone. The proposed assessment for fiscal year 2006-07 for Zone 15 of the District is \$322.22 per parcel and there are 93 parcels.

Zone 15 was established 3 years ago. The proposed budget for fiscal year 2006-07 is \$29,966.

### **Zone 16**

For fiscal year 2006-07, there is a proposed two percent (2%) inflationary increase in the assessment for Zone 16 over the assessment levied in fiscal year 2005-06 and is consistent with ballot proposition approved by the qualified electors when establishing said zone. The proposed assessment for fiscal year 2006-07 for Zone 16 is based on an Equivalent Dwelling Unit (EDU) rate of \$47.84 per year as follows:

1 Single Family lot	=	1 EDU	=	\$ 47.84 per year
1 Multi-Family lot	=	0.7 EDU	=	\$ 33.49 per year
1 Commercial acre	=	8 EDUs	=	\$382.72 per year
1 Industrial acre	=	4 EDUs	=	\$191.36 per year
1,000 sq. ft. of Church building	=	0.5 EDUs	=	\$ 23.92 per year

Zone 16 was established 4 years ago with an assessment of \$44.60 per EDU per year. The proposed budget for fiscal year 2006-07 is \$260,379.

### **Zone 17**

For fiscal year 2006-07, there is a proposed two (2%) inflationary increase in the assessment for Zone 17 over the assessment levied in fiscal year 2005-06 and is consistent with ballot proposition approved by the qualified electors when establishing said zone. The proposed assessment for fiscal year 2006-07 for Zone 17 of the District is \$426.98 per acre. The actual rate property owners pay is based on the parcel size and there is 1 parcel.

Zone 17 was established 3 years ago with an assessment of \$394.56 per acre per year. The proposed budget for fiscal year 2006-07 is \$10,427.

### **Zone 19**

For fiscal year 2006-07, there is a proposed two percent (2%) inflationary increase in the assessment for Zone 19 over the assessment levied in fiscal year 2005-06 and is consistent with ballot proposition approved by the qualified electors when establishing said zone. The proposed assessment for fiscal year 2006-07 for Zone 19 of the District is \$164.54 per parcel and there are 185 parcels.

Zone 19 was established 4 years ago with an assessment of \$152.02 per parcel per year. The proposed budget for fiscal year 2006-07 is \$30,441.

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### **Zone 21**

For fiscal year 2006-07, there is a proposed two percent (2%) inflationary increase in the assessment for Zone 21 over the assessment levied in fiscal year 2005-06 and is consistent with ballot proposition approved by the qualified electors when establishing said zone. The proposed assessment for fiscal year 2006-07 for Zone 21 of the District is \$146.28 per parcel and there are 166 parcels.

Zone 21 was established 4 years ago with an assessment of \$139.16 per parcel per year. The proposed budget for fiscal year 2006-07 is \$24,284.

### **Zone 24**

For fiscal year 2006-07, there is a proposed two percent (2%) inflationary increase in the assessment for Zone 24 over the assessment levied in fiscal year 2005-06 and is consistent with ballot proposition approved by the qualified electors when establishing said zone. The proposed assessment for fiscal year 2006-07 for Zone 24 of the District is \$103.64 per parcel and there are 309 parcels.

Zone 24 was established 3 years ago with an assessment of \$100.00 per parcel per year. The proposed budget for fiscal year 2006-07 is \$32,028.

### **Zone 25**

For fiscal year 2006-07, there is no proposed increase in the assessment for Zone 25. The proposed assessment for fiscal year 2006-07 for Zone 25 of the District is \$137.70 per parcel and there are 777 parcels.

Zone 25 was established 3 years ago with an assessment of \$137.70 per parcel per year. The proposed budget for fiscal year 2006-07 is \$107,000.

### **Zone 26**

For fiscal year 2006-07, there is a proposed two percent (2%) inflationary increase in the assessment for Zone 26 over the assessment levied in fiscal year 2005-06 and is consistent with ballot proposition approved by the qualified electors when establishing said zone. The proposed assessment for fiscal year 2006-07 for Zone 26 of the District is \$113.68 per parcel and there are 185 parcels.

Zone 26 was established 3 years ago with an assessment of \$111.46 per parcel per year. The proposed budget for fiscal year 2006-07 is \$21,032.

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### **Zone 27**

For fiscal year 2006-07, there is no proposed increase in the assessment for Zone 27. The proposed assessment for fiscal year 2006-07 for Zone 27 of the District is \$192.02 per parcel and there are 52 parcels.

Zone 27 was established 3 years ago with an assessment of \$192.02 per parcel per year. The proposed budget for fiscal year 2006-07 is \$9,985.

### **Zone 28**

For fiscal year 2006-07, there is a proposed two percent (2%) inflationary increase in the assessment for Zone 28 over the assessment levied in fiscal year 2005-06 and is consistent with ballot proposition approved by the qualified electors when establishing said zone. The proposed assessment for fiscal year 2006-07 for Zone 28 of the District is \$89.50 per parcel and there are 98 parcels.

Zone 28 was established 3 years ago with an assessment of \$87.76 per parcel per year. The proposed budget for fiscal year 2006-07 is \$8,772.

### **Zone 29**

For fiscal year 2006-07, there is a proposed two percent (2%) inflationary increase in the assessment for Zone 29 over the assessment levied in fiscal year 2005-06 and is consistent with ballot proposition approved by the qualified electors when establishing said zone. The proposed assessment for fiscal year 2006-07 for Zone 29 of the District is \$71.40 per parcel and there are 140 parcels.

Zone 29 was established 3 years ago with an assessment of \$70.00 per parcel per year. The proposed budget for fiscal year 2006-07 is \$9,996.

### **Zone 30**

For fiscal year 2006-07, there is a proposed two percent (2%) inflationary increase in the assessment for Zone 30 over the assessment levied in fiscal year 2005-06 and is consistent with ballot proposition approved by the qualified electors when establishing said zone. The proposed assessment for fiscal year 2006-07 for Zone 30 of the District is \$142.72 per parcel and there are 164 parcels.

Zone 30 was established 3 years ago with an assessment of \$137.18 per parcel per year. The proposed budget for fiscal year 2006-07 is \$23,406.

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### **Zone 31**

For fiscal year 2006-07, there is no proposed increase in the assessment for Zone 31. The proposed assessment for fiscal year 2006-07 for Zone 31 of the District is \$250.00 per parcel and there are 20 parcels.

Zone 31 was established 2 years ago with an assessment of \$250.00 per parcel per year. The proposed budget for fiscal year 2006-07 is \$5,000.

### **Zone 34**

For fiscal year 2006-07, there is no proposed increase in the assessment for Zone 34. The proposed assessment for fiscal year 2006-07 for Zone 34 of the District is \$71.18 per parcel and there are 118 parcels.

Zone 34 was established 2 years ago with an assessment of \$71.18 per parcel per year. The proposed budget for fiscal year 2006-07 is \$8,400.

### **Zone 36**

For fiscal year 2006-07, there is a proposed two percent (2%) inflationary increase in the assessment for Zone 36 over the assessment levied in fiscal year 2005-06 and is consistent with ballot proposition approved by the qualified electors when establishing said zone. The proposed assessment for fiscal year 2006-07 for Zone 36 of the District is \$94.16 per parcel and there are 65 parcels.

Zone 36 was established 2 years ago with an assessment of \$92.30 per parcel per year. The proposed budget for fiscal year 2006-07 is \$6,120.

### **Zone 37**

For fiscal year 2006-07, there is no proposed increase in the assessment for Zone 37. The proposed assessment for fiscal year 2006-07 for Zone 37 of the District is \$99.98 per parcel and there are 153 parcels.

Zone 37 was established 2 years ago with an assessment of \$99.98 per parcel per year. The proposed budget for fiscal year 2006-07 is \$15,295.

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### **Zone 38**

For fiscal year 2006-07, there is a proposed two percent (2%) inflationary increase in the assessment for Zone 38 over the assessment levied in fiscal year 2005-06 and is consistent with ballot proposition approved by the qualified electors when establishing said zone. The proposed assessment for fiscal year 2006-07 for Zone 38 of the District is \$126.96 per parcel and there are 241 parcels.

Zone 38 was established 2 years ago with an assessment of \$124.48 per parcel per year. The proposed budget for fiscal year 2006-07 is \$30,600.

### **Zone 39**

For fiscal year 2006-07, there is no proposed increase in the assessment for Zone 39. The proposed assessment for fiscal year 2006-07 for Zone 39 of the District is \$47.00 per parcel and there are 128 parcels.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors (hereinafter the "Board of Supervisors") of the County of Riverside (hereinafter the "County") has conducted proceedings for and has established Landscaping and Lighting Maintenance District No. 89 -1 - Consolidated of the County of Riverside, State of California (hereinafter "L&LM Dist. 19 (2%) more than the assessments levied for fiscal year 2005-06 and consistent with the terms  
20 of the ballot proposition approving the annexation of each zone; and

21 WHEREAS, it is necessary that the Board of Supervisors adopt a resolution of intention  
22 pursuant to Section 22624 of the Streets and Highways Code, which fixes and gives notice,  
23 pursuant to Section 22626(a) of the Streets and Highways Code, of the time and place of a public  
24 hearing on said Report and the annual assessments for fiscal year 2006-07;
