**SUBJECT: HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT RENEWAL GRANT AGREEMENT—
SHELTER FROM THE STORM**

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors approves and:

1. Authorizes the Chairman of the Board to sign the attached Grant Agreement between Riverside County Department of Public Social Services (DPSS) and the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for the Shelter From The Storm Florence Ridgon House Supportive Housing Project Grant for \$249,962 for the period of August 1, 2006 through July 31, 2007;
2. Authorizes the Chairman of the Board to sign the attached contract between DPSS and Shelter From The Storm;
3. Authorizes the Purchasing Agent to sign any ministerial amendments with Shelter From The Storm, not to exceed the maximum amount of the grant agreement (\$249,962); and
4. Authorizes the Director of DPSS to administer the agreement with Shelter From The Storm.

AGREEMENT— SHELTER FROM THE STORM

BACKGROUND:

On July 7, 2005, (Agenda Item 3.60), your Honorable Board authorized DPSS to submit an application to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development for Homeless Assistance funds, which included the Florence Ridgon House renewal project operated through a contract between Shelter From The Storm and DPSS to provide transitional housing and supportive services to women and children, and youth under 18 years old who are victims of domestic violence.

Shelter From The Storm has served 32 adults and 52 children in families during the current one-year grant which ends on July 31, 2006. Under the attached renewal grant, Shelter From The Storm's goal is to serve 18 adults and 90 children in families.

HUD executed the attached renewal grant agreement on May 18, 2006, which we are forwarding to your Board for approval.
