SUBJECT: Local Government Household Hazardous Waste Grant (15th Cycle) for Fiscal Year 2006/07

RECOMMENDED MOTION:

Adopt Resolution 2006-287 authorizing the Waste Management Department to submit two applications to the California Integrated Waste Management Board for the Local Government Household Hazardous Waste Grant (15th Cycle) Fiscal Year 2006/07.

BACKGROUND: Public Resources Code (PRC) Section 47200 authorizes the California Integrated Waste Management Board (CIWMB) to award grants to local government agencies for programs that reduce the amount of Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) disposed of at solid waste landfills. Grant funds must be used to establish or expand HHW programs; especially those that provide collection opportunities for additional types of waste, innovative or more cost-effective collection methods, and expanded public education opportunities.

In light of the recent expiration of the household exemption for universal waste (u-waste) disposal as mixed waste, these HHW Grant (15th Cycle) applications will focus on projects and methods that provide for increased collection of household and small business u-waste. (Cont'd)

Departmental Concurrence

BACKGROUND: (Cont'd)

HHW Grant (15th Cycle) offers two different types of grants, each with its own unique application package and rules:

County-wide Coordination Grant

There is \$15,000 set aside for county-wide u-waste coordination efforts. Coordination Grants are not competitive; each county-wide area may receive a pre-designated funding amount based on population. Awards will be given to any county-wide area that applies and is willing to complete the terms of the grant. Any jurisdiction may apply to be the coordination lead for their county-wide area. The Waste Management Department is taking the lead role for this part of the 15th Cycle grant application on behalf of the County and its cities. The following entities expressed written support for this grant application: City of Blythe, City of Calimesa, City of Coachella, Coachella Valley Association of Governments, City of Corona, City of Desert Hot Springs, City of Lake Elsinore, City of Moreno Valley, City of Murrieta, City of Rancho Mirage, City of Riverside, and City of Temecula. The grant term for this part of the 15th Cycle Grant is from October 2006 through October 2007.

Infrastructure Grant

There is also \$300,000 available on a competitive basis for multiple jurisdiction infrastructure projects. In cooperation with the Cities of Lake Elsinore, Palm Springs and Riverside, who expressed written support for this grant proposal, the County is proposing to use grant funds to expand the Lake Elsinore Permanent HHW Collection facility to accept Universal Waste, to expand the Palm Springs Antifreeze, Battery, Used Oil, and Latex Paint collection site to accept Universal Waste and other HHW, and to relocate and expand the Pedley Permanent HHW Collection facility to accept Universal Waste. The grant term for this part of the 15th Cycle Grant is from October 2006 through April 2009.

The Waste Management Department (WMD) is seeking approval by the Board of Supervisors to apply for these grant funds from the CIWMB for the Fiscal Year 2006/2007 grant cycle.

The WMD has received Local Government Household Hazardous Waste Grant Program funding from two previous grant cycles. The collection sites have been positively received by the communities served and offer a cost-effective way for residents to properly recycle or dispose of unwanted HHW.

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the General Manager-Chief Engineer, or his/her designee, is hereby authorized and empowered to execute in the name of the County of Riverside, on behalf of itself and the participating cities, all grant documents necessary to secure grant funds and implement the approved grant project.
