SUBJECT: Ratify the Second Amendment to Agreement No. 03-76028 for the Lead Hazard Reduction Compliance and Enforcement Program (LHRC&EP), between the State Department of Health Services and Community Health Agency.

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1) Ratify the Second Amendment to Agreement # 03-76028 with the State Department of Health Services and extend the performance period through June 30, 2007; and
- 2) Authorize the Purchasing Agent to sign future contract amendments limited to the shifting of funds between budgetary line items as needed to facilitate the delivery of program services. Any amendments which would alter the original approved total grant award or change any given fiscal year's revenues or modify the lifetime of the grant will be brought to the Board of Supervisors for approval.
- 3) Authorize the Chairperson to sign eight (8) originals of the Agreement on behalf of the County.

Ratify the Second Amendment to Agreement No. 03-76028 for the Lead Hazard Reduction Compliance and Enforcement Program (LHRC&EP), between the State Department of Health Services and Community Health Agency.

BACKGROUND: (Continued).

In October of 2002, the Governor signed into law SB460 which became effective January 1, 2003. SB 460, entitled "Lead Abatement", made several changes to the California Civil Code (Section 1941.1) and Health and Safety Code (sections 17961, 17980, 124130, and 105251-57) which codified lead-based paint hazards as an actionable violation of State law. This law also grants authority to local health departments, environmental health departments and code enforcement authorities to enforce the abatement of lead paint hazards, with emphasis in abating hazards in the home environment of lead poisoned children. This law also establishes penalties for those who create, or refuse to abate lead paint hazards.

The State Department of Health Services is funding counties throughout the State to establish local "Lead Hazard Reduction Compliance and Enforcement Programs". Through this program, the Department of Public Health provides lead-based paint technical assistance / consultation to local code enforcement agencies throughout the County. This amendment will enable the Department to continue to offer these services.

Financial Data:

The original Grant was for \$253,383. During the start-up process since FY 03/04 the County has been allowed to roll-over unused funding to the next fiscal year of the original three year grant. This amendment is providing a one-year term extension through FY 06/07 to allow the Department of Public Health to expend the remaining of \$112,589.
