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BACKGROUND:

On February 1, 2006 Riverside County Purchasing and Fleet Services released Request for Proposals for the CAPIT Program (PUARC-802), PSSF Program (PUARC-803), and Differential Response (PUARC-805). The RFPs closed on March 1, 2006 with 44 proposals submitted from 29 organizations. As a result of the RFPs, 17 organizations were recommended to receive funding. On May 16, 2006, (Agenda #3.20), your Honorable Board approved the FY06/07 CAPIT & PSSF Funding Recommendations.

Subsequent to the funding recommendations being approved, DPSS entered into contract negotiations with the awarded bidders. During the contract negotiation process it was determined that one organization would be unable to provide counseling services to all members of the target population. Therefore, it was mutually agreed upon not to award funding for counseling services to that organization.

Consequently, DPSS is seeking your Honorable Board's approval to reallocate a total of \$125,000 for counseling services to MFI Recovery Center (MFI) since they had the next highest scoring proposal. These funds will be utilized by MFI to provide individual and group counseling services throughout Riverside County, but primarily to the underserved communities located within the Fourth Supervisorial District.

MFI's agreement will have a one-year renewal option for fiscal year 07/08 with the same maximum annual amount of \$178,540, of which \$125,000 will be allocated for counseling services and \$53,540 will be allocated for parenting education classes.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

No County General Funds will be utilized for these services.
