**SUBJECT:** Ratify the Agreement with Regents of the University of Colorado #04-041 for the Nurse Family Partnership Program.

**BACKGROUND:** (Continued).

The Nurse Family Partnership (NFP - previously known as Prenatal and Early Childhood Nurse Home Visitation Program - PECNHV) is a highly acclaimed, well-tested national model that provides in-home visitations by Public Health Nurses (PHNs). The goal of this program is to improve the health and social functioning of low-income, first-time mothers and their babies (ages birth-24 months). Data collection and statistical reports show an outcome measurement that certifies Riverside County, Department of Public Health, and Public Health Nursing to use this NFP Program through the University of Colorado.

The Regents of the University of Colorado has drafted a new agreement for the performance period of July 1, 2006 through June 30, 2009 in the amount of 27,575. The University of Colorado provides training and statistical support for four (4) Public Health Nurses and one (1) Supervising Public Health Nurse. The project staff (4PHNs) participates in intensive training on program replication and implementation at the University of Colorado Health Science Center. Home visits begin during pregnancy and follow a visitation schedule for two years after the child is born. Nurse home visitors work with a caseload of 25 families each, to promote health, environmental health, quality of care giving for the infant/toddler, maternal life course development, and family and friend support. Nurse home visitors also link families with other community health and human services.
