

SUBJECT: Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the City of Murrieta and the County of Riverside Funding the Scott Road / I-215 Interchange Improvement Projects.

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board approve the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the County and the City of Murrieta to provide funding for the Scott Road / I-215 Interchange Improvement Projects and authorize the Chairman of the Board to execute the same.

BACKGROUND: Construction work has begun on the installation of interim improvements to the Scott Road / I-215 Interchange. These interim improvements consist of the installation of traffic signals and widening of the ramps, and widening on Scott Road (not including the overpass) for turn lanes approaching the interchange. This project also includes the installation of a traffic signal at Haun Road / Scott Road.

RE: Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the City of Murrieta and the County of Riverside Funding the Scott Road / I-215 Interchange Improvement Projects.

September 18, 2006

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The City of Murrieta has jurisdiction over $\frac{1}{4}$ of the Interchange. The Transportation Department has negotiated an agreement with the City whereby the City will fund 25% of the interchange interim improvements (\$505,000). Additionally, the City will also construct intersection improvements and signalization of the intersection of Antelope Road and Scott Road (immediately East of the interchange) without financial participation from the County.

The County is also working on the environmental process and design of the ultimate Scott Road interchange improvements (which will include overpass widening), which are expected to start construction in approximately four years. The County has formed a Community Facilities District (CFD) to fully fund the ultimate interchange improvements using TUMF funds credits.

The attached MOU sets the mutual understandings and funding and payment terms for the interim and ultimate improvements for the Scott Road / I-215 Interchange.
