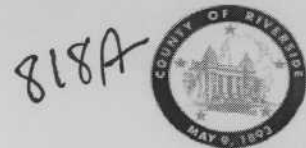


SUBJECT: 2006 David Goldware Friend of the Veteran Award Presentations



BACKGROUND: themselves through service to veterans. The award is named after local philanthropist and veterans' activist, David Goldware, a proud Navy veteran who many years of community service included countless projects benefiting veterans. Former recipients of the award include Michael Goldware (Dave's son), Will Kleindienst (then Mayor of Palm Springs), Alta Marlin, Lee Millett Jr., San Jacinto Mayor, Jim Ayers, and retired Marine, Buck Galbraith.

In 2004, the VAC added a business award category to recognize businesses or groups who go above and beyond their mission statements to serve veterans. Winners in this category have included Stater Bros. Markets and Martin Luther King High School's "King High Remembers" program.

The VAC's recommendation for the 2006 individual category winner is LEO MARTIN "MARTY" SCHLOCKER. A former WWII POW, Marty faithfully volunteers at the Loma Linda VA Medical Center, helping veterans less fortunate than himself. He is a key member of the National Cemetery Support Committee and the VA Medical Center's POW advisory Committee.

The VAC's recommendation for the 2006 business category winner is WAL-MART - CORONA. With Eugene Fizek taking the lead, Wal-Mart donates goods and services to help homeless veterans, indigent veterans and their families at Christmas time and countless veteran service organizations.

At the Board's regular meeting on October 17th, the Board will be joined by VAC chairwoman Alice B. Chandler, by the County Veterans Services Officer and by Nick Goldware to help coordinate the presentations.
