SUBJECT: APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION NUMBER 2006-4 AUTHORIZING THE FILING OF AN APPLICATION FOR GRANT FUNDING FOR THE CALIFORNIA RIVER PARKWAYS PROGRAM UNDER THE WATER SECURITY, CLEAN DRINKING WATER, COASTAL AND BEACH PROTECTION ACT OF 2002 (PROPOSITION 50)

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Directors Approve Resolution No. 2006-4 Authorizing the Regional Park and Open Space District to Apply for and Expend Grant Funds under the Proposition 50 River Parkways Program.

BACKGROUND: Under the Water Security, Clean Drinking Water, Coastal and Beach Protection Act of 2002 ("Proposition 50"), the California Resources Agency administers a competitive program under which grant funds are available for trail projects located along rivers and streams. Among the requirements of the grant is a resolution adopted by the governing body of the public agency applicant.

Attached is Resolution 2006-4, which approves the filing of an application for Proposition 50 grant funding and certifies that the Park District will comply with applicable laws and has sufficient funding to operate and maintain the project.

SUBJECT: APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION NUMBER 2006-4 AUTHORIZING THE FILING OF APPLICATIONS FOR GRANT FUNDING UNDER THE WATER SECURITY, CLEAN DRINKING WATER, COASTAL AND BEACH PROTECTION ACT OF 2002 (PROPOSITION 50)

The grant application, now being completed by Park District staff, will request \$1,784,851 in Proposition 50 River parkways funds to design and construct a 2.2 mile segment of the Santa Ana River Trail and Parkway running from the western end of Prado Basin west to the Green River Golf Course. The project includes the following elements: securing of consultants and contractors for trail design and construction services; a 12-foot wide paved bicycle trail and a parallel 10-foot wide stabilized decomposed granite trail for equestrians and pedestrians, separated by a four-foot buffer; a prefabricated clear span bridge of approximately 100 feet in length; site preparation; design and construction of up to four overlooks with seating and interpretive panels; post and rail fencing; and warning and informational signs to be placed along the trail.

The total cost for this project is estimated at \$2,684,851. If grant funds are awarded by the Resources Agency, the Park District will seek approval from your Board to appropriate \$900,000 in grant matching funds from the West County Multipurpose Trail Development Impact Fee source.

RESOLUTION OF THE RIVERSIDE COUNTY REGIONAL PARK AND

APPROVING THE APPLICATION FOR GRANT FUNDS FOR
THE CALIFORNIA RIVER PARKWAYS GRANT PROGRAM
UNDER THE WATER SECURITY, CLEAN DRINKING WATER,
COASTAL AND BEACH PROTECTION ACT OF 2002 (Proposition 50)

WHEREAS, the Legislature and Governor of the State of California have provided funds for the program shown above; and

WHEREAS, the Resources Agency has been delegated the responsibility for the administration of this grant program, establishing necessary procedures; and

WHEREAS, said procedures established by the State Resources Agency require a resolution certifying the approval of application(s) by the Applicant's governing board before submission of said application(s) to the State; and

WHEREAS, the Applicant, if selected, will enter into an agreement with the State of California to carry out the Project

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Riverside County Regional Park and Open-Space District Board of Directors:

1. Approves the filing of an application for the Santa Ana River Trail, Prado Basin to Green River project (Project);
2. Certifies that Applicant understands the assurances and certification in the application; and

3. Certifies that Applicant or title holder will have sufficient funds to operate and maintain the Project consistent with the land tenure requirements, or will secure the resources to do so; and
4. Certifies that it will comply with the provisions of Section 1771.8 of the State Labor Code regarding payment of prevailing wages on Projects awarded Proposition 50 Funds; and
5. If applicable, certifies that the Project will comply with any laws and regulations including, but not limited to, legal requirements for building codes, health and safety codes, disabled access laws, and, that prior to commencement of construction, all applicable permits will have been obtained; and
6. Appoints the General Manager of the Riverside County Regional Park and Open Space District, or designee, as agent to conduct all negotiations, execute and submit all documents including, but not limited to applications, agreements, payment requests and so on, which may be necessary for the completion of the aforementioned Project.
