**SUBJECT: Adoption of Resolution No. 2006-452 Authorizing Submittal of Waste Tire Enforcement Grant Application**

**RECOMMENDED MOTION:**

That the Board of Supervisors:

1. Authorize the Code Enforcement Department to apply for and accept State grant funds to enforce waste tire laws. The Director of Code Enforcement or his designee is to implement and sign the grant documents.
2. Adopt Resolution No. 2006-452 Authorizing Submittal of Waste Tire Enforcement Grant Application.

**BACKGROUND:**

The California Tire Recycling Act of 1989 (AB 1843) authorized the creation of the Tire Recycling Program and the California Tire Recycling Management Fund. A fee, currently \$1.75 per tire, is assessed on the sale of new tires, and collected revenue is deposited quarterly into the tire fund. The California Integrated Waste Management Board (CIWMB) administers the Waste Tire Enforcement Grant Program which allows cities and counties to seek funds for establishing their own waste tire enforcement programs. To encourage participation, the grant application process is a non-competitive process in which participating agencies are ensured of a stable source of funding. (Continued)

The purpose of the grant is to inspect waste tire facilities, tire dealers, auto dismantlers, tire haulers and other points of waste tire generation to ensure compliance with all applicable laws and regulations, including the manifest system and investigate complaints, referrals and illegal tire disposal activities. It is estimated that Riverside County has over 800 tire facilities and sites. Facility inspections will be followed up with appropriate compliance and enforcement actions to ensure that operators are following all tire facility regulations, including storage standards, use of registered tire haulers and manifest requirements. Code staff has met with staff from the Waste Management Department, Department of Environmental Health, and California Highway Patrol to discuss the grant and these departments have agreed to assist in the tire program.

The grant request is for \$300,000 per year. Waste Board staff has indicated that the county may be eligible for a similar level of annual funding over the next five years. All costs to be funded must be directly and clearly related to implementation and operation of the program funded by this grant. Award of the FY 2006-2007 Waste Tire Enforcement Grant is contingent upon and subject to the availability of funds. The Waste Board reserves the right to fund individual phases of selected proposals, and therefore, may fund an amount less than requested. In accordance with Policy A-30, the contract or grant award will be brought to the Board for its approval prior to acceptance of the grant.

6 BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside, State of California,  
7 in regular session assembled on November 28, 2006, that:

8 WHEREAS, funds are allocated and available from the California Integrated Waste Management  
9 Board for grants to solid waste Local Enforcement Agencies (LEA) and cities and counties with  
10 regulatory authority within the city and county government to perform enforcement/compliance and  
11 surveillance activities at waste tire facilities; and

12 WHEREAS, the California Integrated Waste Management Board has been delegated the  
13 responsibility for the administration of the program within the state, setting up necessary procedures  
14 governing application by cities and counties under the program; and

15 WHEREAS, the applicant demonstrates it has sufficient staff resources, technical expertise,  
16 and/or experience with similar projects to carry out the proposed program; and

17 WHEREAS, the applicant will enter into an agreement with the State of California for  
18 implementation of a waste tire enforcement program, pending final approval by this Board;

19 NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved that the Board of Supervisors authorizes the submittal of an  
20 application to the California Integrated Waste management Board for a Waste Tire Enforcement Grant for  
21 a period of 2006 through 2011.

22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of the Code Enforcement Department, or their  
23 designee, is hereby authorized and empowered to execute in the name of Riverside County all necessary  
24 applications, contracts, payment requests, agreements, and amendments hereto for the purposes of  
25 securing grant funds and to implement and carry out the purposes specified in the application.
