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The hourly rates for Environmental Health under Ordinance No. 671 were last revised in 2004, representing costs for the 2004-2005 Fiscal Year. The changes presented on Attachment A reflect:

- The cumulative impact of salary and benefit increases. These rates have been reviewed by the Auditor Controller and are consistent with those approved by the Board for Environmental Health Service Fees under Riverside County Ordinance No. 640.8 on June 6, 2006.
- Three (3) New job Classifications resulting from the designation of the Environmental Health Specialists Series (III, IV and Supervisor in the desert as "Difficult to Recruit" positions).
- New fee categories for Environmental Health Technicians and a Public Health Professional Engineer/Geologist.

Overtime Rate

The overtime rate is derived by adding the additional salary costs (50% of hourly pay) to the hourly billing rate.
