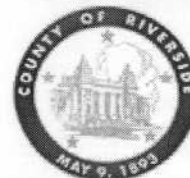

SUBJECT: Approval for Overtime – Esperanza Fire

RECOMMENDED MOTION: Request Approval Overtime for Exempt Employees working Esperanza Fire

BACKGROUND: In response to the October 26, 2006, Esperanza arson fire that resulted in the over 4,500 acres burned, several County employees who do not normally receive overtime compensation, worked extended hours to save lives and residents' homes. Of those employees, there were two Fire Department and fourteen (14) Sheriff's Department employees who performed emergency services without the benefit of overtime compensation. Pursuant to the current Memorandum of Understanding between the Riverside County Law Enforcement Management Unit and County's Management Resolution No. 2006-395, the Board of Supervisors can approve overtime compensation in the event of natural disasters. It is recommended that these employees be compensated at the rate of one and one-half times their current regular pay rate for the time worked during the Esperanza fire.
