**SUBJECT:** Agreement between Riverside County Children and Families Commission (First 5 Riverside) and the Riverside County Office on Aging for the period January 01, 2007 through June 30, 2008.

**BACKGROUND:** The Grandparents Raising Grandchildren Task Force created by the Board of Supervisors was first convened by the Office on Aging and the Advisory Council on Aging in October 1998. The Grandparents Raising Grandchildren Program under the direction of this Task Force addresses the multiple and complex issues of grandparents raising grandchildren in Riverside County. One of the biggest issues for grandparents raising grandchildren is finding affordable child care.

Funds provided under this agreement provide child care and respite for grandparents raising grandchildren ages 0-5. Grandparents that are still in the workforce cannot always afford the high cost of child care, especially if they are caring for more than one child. Many retired grandparents have to return to work in order to raise their grandchildren and need assistance with child care. Funds from First 5 Riverside have helped ease the burden of child care costs for many grandparents.

The Respite Child Care Program requires the necessary program and department infrastructure to operate effectively and to insure that quality services are delivered to the grandparents raising grandchildren in Riverside County. First 5 Riverside has compensated the department for those expenses at a level of 10% of the grant amount. With this grant renewal cycle, First 5 Riverside has reduced the effective support of department infrastructure for the Respite Child Care program to 10% of operating expenses. This has caused the department to realize a reduction of approximately \$24,000 in revenue to meet indirect department costs for oversight and operation of the Respite Child Care Program. The department will request additional funding as part of its FY2007-2008 budget request.
