SUBJECT: Public Hearing on the 2007-2008 One-Year Action Plan of the County of Riverside 2004-2009 Five-Year Consolidated Plan for Community Planning and Development Programs.

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors conduct a public hearing to obtain citizens' views on community development and housing needs for the County of Riverside 2007-2008 One-Year Action Plan of the Five-Year Consolidated Plan.

BACKGROUND: To comply with the federal requirements in the preparation of the 2007-2008 One-Year Action Plan, a public comment period opened February 23, 2007, and will end March 20, 2007. The public hearing on March 20, 2007, provides an opportunity for citizens to comment on the One-Year Action Plan and the needs of their community. Public Notice requirements regarding the requested March 20, 2007 public hearing have been fulfilled by the Economic Development Agency.

It is anticipated that the Board of Supervisors will adopt the 2007-2008 One-Year Action Plan at its regular meeting on May 8, 2007. The plan will identify the activities funded for the Community Development Block Grant, Home Investment Partnership, and Emergency Shelter Grant Programs. The 2007-2008 One-Year Action Plan will then be forwarded to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development on May 16, 2007, for final review and approval.

Notice is hereby given that the County of Riverside Board of Supervisors will hold a public hearing on the Proposed 2007-2008 One Year Action Plan of the 2004-2009 Consolidated Plan on March 20, 2007, at 1:30 p.m., in the Board of Supervisors' Chambers, County Administrative Center, 4080 Lemon Street, 1st floor, Riverside, CA.

The public may present oral or written comments during the public hearing. Furthermore, the public may review the Proposed 2007-2008 One Year Action Plan and submit comments prior to the public hearing starting February 23 until 9:00 AM on March 20, 2007. It is anticipated that the Board of Supervisors will approve and adopt the 2007-2008 One Year Action Plan at its regular meeting of May 8, 2007. The 2007-2008 One Year Action Plan of the 2004-2009 Consolidated Plan will then be forwarded to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development on or about May 15, 2007.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY. The primary objective of the County's CPD programs is the development of viable urban communities by providing decent housing, a suitable living environment, and expansion of economic opportunities, principally for persons of very low, low, and moderate incomes. The Board of Supervisors adopted a five-year 2004-2009 Consolidated Plan and a Fair Housing Impediment Study on May 4, 2004. The One Year Action Plan is a portion of the Consolidated Plan that must be updated annually. It provides detailed information on the resources the County expects to receive and the activities to be undertaken to meet the priority needs identified in the Consolidated Plan. At the completion of the Citizen Participation process and after comments have been received, the County will prepare and submit the final 2007-2008 One Year Action Plan of the Five Year Consolidated Plan to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. This is anticipated to occur on May 15, 2007.

ANTICIPATED FUNDS. Anticipated allocations to be received through the 2007 HUD appropriations are: \$10,488,729 for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program; \$3,594,993 for the Home Investment Partnership (HOME) program, including the Community Housing Development Organizations (CHDO) program; and \$439,329 for the Emergency Shelter Grant (ESG) program. The County expects to utilize 85% of the CPD funds for activities that will benefit low and moderate-income persons.

SUMMARY OF PROPOSED ONE YEAR PLAN ACTIVITIES. The County received 223 proposals for 2007-08 CPD funding totaling \$17,173,964. The proposed activities included public service, public facility improvements, acquisition, rehabilitation, micro-enterprise development, and others. Housing assistance proposals include: Home Rehabilitation Program (HRP) loans (\$300,000), Senior Home Repair (SHR) loans and grants (\$200,000), and Individual Development Accounts (IDA) program (\$100,000). Emergency Shelter Grant proposal requests, for both essential services and operations totaled \$1,447,300. HOME program proposals include: HOME New Construction

(\$1,348,122); HOME Direct Ownership (\$1,348,122); HOME/CHDO Set-Aside (\$539,249); and HOME administration (\$349,499). Proposals for Economic Development assistance activities: Hire-A-Youth (HAY) program (\$200,000), County Wide Public Facilities activities (\$500,000). General management and administrative activities include: oversight of consolidated programs (\$1,957,746) and Fair Housing Program (\$100,000).

DISPLACEMENT. Planned activities will be designed to minimize the displacement of persons. Provisions for relocation benefits to displaced persons and replacement of low-and moderate-income housing units demolished or converted to another use as a result of CDBG funded activities will be consistent with the County's Anti-Displacement and Relocation Assistance Plan and provisions of the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Act of 1970, as amended.

CITIZEN PARTICIPATION AND COMMENTS. From September through December, 2006, the Economic Development Agency initiated its Citizen Participation process by notifying Cooperating Cities, community members, and public and private agencies of the Community Development 2007-2008 Program Year. Public meetings were held in the cooperating cities and fourteen unincorporated communities to report on CDBG performance and to request citizen input in identifying housing and community development needs. A *Notification of Funding Availability* was published in November 2006 for the CDBG program, and a *Notification of Funding Availability* for ESG program was published in November 2006.

PARTICIPATING COMMUNITIES. The 2004-2009 Consolidated Plan will cover the unincorporated areas of the County and the following cooperating cities: Banning, Beaumont, Blythe, Cathedral City, Canyon Lake, Desert Hot Springs, Indio, Lake Elsinore, La Quinta, Murrieta, Norco, Perris, San Jacinto, and Temecula.

IMPLEMENTATION. The goals for the 2007-2008 One Year Action Plan of the Consolidated Plan include: creating affordable housing for those of very low, low, and moderate income; providing home ownership opportunities for first time buyers; improving conditions of substandard housing and rental housing; addressing farm worker housing needs; ensuring the availability of emergency shelters to address the needs of the homeless; creating housing opportunities for the elderly, especially the frail elderly; creating supportive housing or shelter for persons afflicted with HIV/AIDS; creating rental assistance through subsidy programs; providing short term shelter for the mentally ill homeless; creating a suitable living environment by improving public facilities and services; and providing economic development opportunities for very low, low, and moderate income families.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

I. INTRODUCTION

The annual One Year Action Plan (OYAP) provides a one-year strategy to accomplish the goals and objectives listed in the County of Riverside's Five-Year Consolidated Plan. The Consolidated Plan serves as the foundation of the County's performance measurement system of the Community Planning and Development (CPD) funded programs of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The CPD programs include the following: Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program; the Home Investment Partnership (HOME) program; and the Emergency Shelter Grant (ESG) program.

The Board of Supervisors adopted the 2004-2009 Five-Year Consolidated Plan and Fair Housing Impediment Study on May 4, 2004. These plans outline the County's strategies and resources to create viable communities which offer decent affordable housing, a suitable living environment, and expanded economic development opportunities primarily for extremely low, very low, and moderate-income persons.

The County of Riverside Board of Supervisors will hold a public hearing on the Proposed 2007-2008 One Year Action Plan of the 2004-2009 Consolidated Plan on March 20, 2007, at 1:30 p.m., in the Board of Supervisors' Chambers, County Administrative Center, 4080 Lemon Street, 1st floor, Riverside, CA. The public may present oral or written during the public hearing. Furthermore, the public may review the Proposed 2007-2008 One Year Action Plan and written submit comments prior to the Public Hearing starting February 23 until 9:00 AM on March 20, 2007.

At the completion of the Citizen Participation process and after comments have been received, it is anticipated that the Board of Supervisors will approve and adopt the 2007-2008 One Year Action Plan of the 2004-2009 Consolidated Plan at its regular meeting on May 8, 2007 which will then be forwarded to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development on or about May 15, 2007.

II. ANTICIPATED FUNDING ALLOCATIONS:

Anticipated allocations to be received through the 2007 U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) appropriations are: \$10,559,051 for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program; \$3,576,054 for the Home Investment Partnership (HOME) program, \$51,155 for the American Dream Downpayment Initiative and \$452,373 for the Emergency Shelter Grant (ESG) program. The County expects to utilize 85% of the CPD funds for activities that will benefit low and moderate-income persons.

Additionally, the County anticipates receiving approximately \$500,000 in *program income* generated through its revolving loan programs.

III. CITIZEN PARTICIPATION AND COMMENTS

From September through December, 2006, the Economic Development Agency initiated its Citizen Participation process by notifying Cooperating Cities, community members, and public and private agencies of the Community Development 2007-2008 Program Year. Public meetings were held in the cooperating cities and in unincorporated communities to report on the performance of the CPD-funded programs and to request citizen input in identifying housing and community development needs. A *Notification of Funding Availability* was published in November 2006 for the CDBG and ESG programs.

IV. ONE YEAR ACTION PLAN

The One Year Action Plan addresses community needs and priorities that are outlined in the Five Year Consolidated Plan. It provides detailed information on the resources the County expects to receive and the activities to be undertaken to meet the priority needs. The primary objective of the County's Community Planning and Development (CPD) CDBG, HOME, and ESG programs is the development of viable urban communities by providing decent housing, a suitable living environment, and expansion of economic opportunities.

The County achieves the objectives of the **CDBG** program by providing grant funds to local government agencies, cooperating cities and non-profit organizations for projects which construct public facilities, preserve and expand housing stock, stimulate the local economy, and improve public service primarily for persons of low and moderate income

There are currently fourteen (14) Cooperating Cities that participate in the County's CDBG program and receive an annual allocation based upon the HUD *Fair Share Formula*. The ESG and HOME funds are distributed to eligible activities on a case-by-case basis regardless throughout the County.

The **HOME** Program is a federally funded grant program for housing designed to assist local governments expand the supply of affordable housing and to assure that federal housing services, financing, and other investments are provided to local governments in a coordinated, supportive fashion. Funds are allocated by formula to participating jurisdictions. The program allows great flexibility with respect to the types of projects to be assisted (new construction or rehab), the form and amount of financing, the types of housing, and the households assisted.

The County receives an annual **ESG** allocation to assist, protect and improve living conditions for the homeless. The County's annual allocation is used to support the maintenance and operations of emergency and homeless shelters, to provide essential services to the homeless, and to prevent homelessness.

V. SUMMARY OF PROPOSED ONE YEAR PLAN ACTIVITIES

Community Development Block Grant: The County received approximately 220 proposals for the 2007-08 CDBG allocation totaling \$17,173,964. The proposed activities included

public service, public facility improvements, acquisition, rehabilitation, economic development and micro-enterprise development, public facilities, and others.

CDBG Housing: The Housing Division of the Economic Development Agency is proposing the following programs using CDBG funds:

Home Rehabilitation Program (HRP) loans \$300,000
Senior Home Repair (SHR) loans and grants \$200,000
Individual Development Accounts (IDA) \$100,000

Emergency Shelter Grant: The County received nine (9) proposals for the 2007-2009 ESG allocation, totaling \$1,447,300, for essential services, operations and maintenance, and homeless prevention.

HOME Program: The Housing Division of the Economic Development Agency submitted four (4) proposals for the 2007- 2008 HOME allocation:
