**BACKGROUND:** (Continued)

SCE prepared an Electric Service Design for the Perris Complex and provided pricing to perform a segment of the electric service work. However, the County had to solicit bids from SCE approved electrical vendors to provide work excluded by SCE.

The nature of the work, installing portions of Edison's infrastructure, limits the parties that may perform this work. Only Edison and a select few Edison approved vendors are allowed to perform work on Edison's infrastructure. A work scope was developed and requests for bids were issued to three local Edison approved electrical vendors with the capacity to perform this work.

After evaluating all of the proposals Facilities Management awarded the contract to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder.
