SUBJECT: Approval of 2007 Juvenile Accountability Block Grant Application and Resolution No. 2007-234.

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1) Approve the 2007 Juvenile Accountability Block Grant application; and
- 2) Adopt Resolution Number 2007-234, authorizing the Chief Probation Officer to sign the grant agreement
- 3) Authorize the Chief Probation Officer to sign an agreement with the City of La Quinta for their portion of the grant.

BACKGROUND: The State Corrections Standards Authority (CSA) has allocated funding to the County under the Federal Juvenile Accountability Block Grant (JABG) 2007 Program. The purpose of this funding is to promote development or continuation of local juvenile justice programs that hold juvenile offenders accountable to the community and courts. Due to reduced federal funding available the allocation to Riverside County for expenditure during FY 2007/08 is \$81,633, a decline from the FY 2006-07 grant amount of \$87,960. The required 10% local match of \$9,070 brings the total project budget to \$90,703.

In FY 2006-07 the JABG funding of \$46,248 was used to support the collection of data for the Coachella Valley Gang Task Force by reimbursing the salaries and benefits of an Office Assistant position from the Sheriff's Department including services and supplies.

The balance of the JABG funding is to be made available for reimbursement to the City of La Quinta for expenditures on behalf of the Gang Task Force for services and supplies. The City of La Quinta will fund their share of the match. The Probation Department will prepare a funding agreement between the city and county.

The allocation of project funded to the two agencies will be:

**RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE
COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE, STATE OF CALIFORNIA
AUTHORIZING SUBMITTAL OF
JUVENILE ACCOUNTABILITY BLOCK GRANT APPLICATION**

WHEREAS, the County of Riverside desires to receive and utilize federal grant funds available through the Juvenile Accountability Block Grant (JABG) Program administered by the Corrections Standards Authority (hereinafter referred to as CSA); now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside, State of California, in regular session assembled on May 15, 2007 that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside does hereby:

1. Authorize, in behalf of the County of Riverside Board of Supervisors, the Chief Probation Officer to submit the JABG application and to sign the Grant Agreement with CSA, including any amendment thereof that does not change the basic scope or terms;
2. Agree to provide all matching funds required for said project, and abide by the statutes and regulations governing the JABG Program as well as the terms and conditions of the Grant Agreement as set forth by the CSA; and
3. Assure that the grant funds received hereunder shall not be used to supplant expenditures controlled by this body.
