SUBJECT: Appointment of Member of Prop. 10 Commission

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors appoint Jay Hoffman as a member of the Prop. 10 Commission effective immediately for a three (3) year term ending June 30, 2010.

BACKGROUND: The Riverside County Children and Families Commission was established by this Board in the adoption of Ordinance 784, enacted on January 22, 1999. The Commission, which is also known as First 5 Riverside, implements the provisions of Proposition 10, which mandates early childhood programs funded from revenue on tobacco products. There is currently a vacant position on the Commission, which was previously filled by Dr. Long of the Riverside County Office of Education and his designee. The current Ordinance requires that the position be filled by a representative of the Education community in Riverside County. The vacant position was posted in May, 2007 in accordance with the provisions of Government Code section 54970 et. seq. One response was received during the open period for the applications, from Dr. Jay Hoffman, Superintendent of Nuvview Union School District.

Dr. Hoffman will be a tremendous asset to the Prop. 10 Commission, as a result of his commitment to the needs of children 0-5, and his familiarity with First 5 Riverside. As Superintendent of Nuvew Union School District, Dr. Hoffman has implemented the first District wide Universal Preschool program in the State; several other programs for young students including Parents as Teachers and an Immunization Clinic; received grants from the David and Lucille Packard Foundation; and actively participated in a number of First 5 activities. He was recently awarded the 2007 Marcus Foster Memorial Award for Administrative Excellence from the Association of California School Administrators.
