**SUBJECT:** Resolution No. 2007-250 Authorizing Riverside County Waste Management Department To Apply For And Receive Grant Funding From California Integrated Waste Management Board Household Hazardous Waste Discretionary Grant Program and Used Oil Recycling Block Grant Program

**RECOMMENDED MOTION:** That the Board of Supervisors:

Adopt Resolution No. 2007-250: 1) Authorizing the Waste Management Department to submit applications to the California Integrated Waste Management Board for grant funding through the Household Hazardous Waste Discretionary Grant Program and Used Oil Recycling Block Grant Program for a five (5) year period from the date of adoption of the Resolution, and 2) Authorizing the General Manager-Chief Engineer, or designee, to execute documents and program(s) for any awarded grant funding.

**BACKGROUND:** Following adoption by the Board of Supervisors, Resolution No. 2007-250 enables the Waste Management Department to apply for any grant funding offered over the next five (5) years by the California Integrated Waste Management Board (CIWMB) through their Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Discretionary Grant Program and their Used Oil Recycling Block Grant (UOBG) Program. It also gives authority to the Department's General Manager-Chief Engineer, or designee, to execute all grant documents necessary to secure any awarded grant funds from these programs and to implement the approved grant project. **BACKGROUND:** *(Continued)*

HHW Discretionary Grant Program

The HHW Discretionary Grant Program was established pursuant to Assembly Bill 1220 (Eastin, Statutes of 1993, Ch. 656), which authorized the CIWMB to allocate grant funding from the Integrated Waste Management Account, upon appropriation by the legislature, for cities, counties, or other local agencies with the responsibility for solid waste management to enhance or establish local programs or infrastructure that serve to prevent the improper disposal of HHW and other hazardous wastes in solid waste landfills. These various HHW grants, which are discretionary and awarded on a competitive basis during grant cycles, have proven necessary in reducing costs associated with the proper collection, recycling, and disposal of these types of waste. The Waste Management Department is currently using a regional HHW grant it received toward the establishment of a HHW collection facility to replace the Pedley HHW facility when it closes and toward expanding the Lake Elsinore and Palm Springs HHW facilities for electronic wastes (E-waste). Another HHW grant is being used by the Department to establish a HHW collection facility at its Lamb Canyon Landfill off Highway 79 and to fund public education efforts.

UOBG Program

The California Oil Recycling Enhancement Act (Chapter 871, statutes of 1991) mandates that the CIWMB provide funds to cities and counties for establishing and maintaining local used oil collection programs that encourage recycling or appropriate disposal of used motor oil. The UOBG is a non-competitive grant and does not require matching funds. Each annual grant cycle has a three year term. The Waste Management Department has applied for and received UOBG funding since 1993. The CIWMB has estimated that Riverside County will be eligible for approximately \$127,066 through its 13<sup>th</sup> Cycle (FY 2007/2008) UOBG.

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING RIVERSIDE COUNTY WASTE MANAGEMENT  
DEPARTMENT TO APPLY FOR AND RECEIVE GRANT FUNDING FROM CALIFORNIA  
INTEGRATED WASTE MANAGEMENT BOARD HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE  
DISCRETIONARY GRANT PROGRAM AND USED OIL RECYCLING GRANT  
PROGRAM**

**WHEREAS**, the people of the State of California have enacted Assembly Bill 1220 (Eastin, Statutes of 1993, Ch. 656) that provides Household Hazardous Waste Grants (HHW Grants) to local governments to establish and implement waste diversion and separation programs to prevent disposal of hazardous waste, including household hazardous waste, in solid waste landfills; and,

**WHEREAS**, the people of the State of California have enacted the California Oil Recycling Enhancement Act that provide for Used Oil Recycling Grants to eligible cities and counties for establishing and maintaining local used oil collection programs that encourage recycling or appropriate disposal of used oil; and,

**WHEREAS**, the California Integrated Waste Management Board has been delegated the responsibility for administering the Used Oil and HHW Grant programs, which includes procedures governing the application by and payment to eligible cities and counties; and,

**WHEREAS**, if awarded, the applicant will enter into a Grant Agreement(s) with the California Integrated Waste Management Board for implementation of said grants;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Riverside County Board of Supervisors authorizes the submittal of grant applications to the California Integrated Waste Management Board for all available Household Hazardous Waste grants and Used Oil Recycling grants for the period of five years from date of adoption of this resolution.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the General Manager – Chief Engineer, or his/her designee, is hereby authorized and empowered to execute in the name of the County of
