SUBJECT: Request for Sole Source with the Joslin Diabetes Center, Inc. for Professional Consultation and Materials for Program Development.

RECOMMENDED MOTION: 1) Approve the sole source purchase of professional consultation and educational material from the Joslin Diabetes Center, Inc. without securing competitive bids in accordance with Ordinance 459.5 in an amount not to exceed \$200,000; and (2) Authorize the Assistant CEO/Human Resources Director to execute such documents as are necessary to implement said purchase.

BACKGROUND: In 1999, the Board of Supervisors established the County's self-funded Exclusive Provider Option (EPO) health plan, Exclusive Care, to provide a value health plan option to the employees of Riverside County and their families.

With diabetes reaching epidemic proportions, Exclusive Care has worked closely with the Community Health Agency (CHA) and Riverside County Regional Medical Center (RCRMC) to pool expertise and develop a high quality disease management program that focuses on the treatment of diabetes.

Background (cont.)

Evidence suggests that significant numbers of diabetics receive less than optimum care from their primary care physician, in part based upon limited office visits and lack of “team” resources to address complex lifestyle issues. The objective of the Diabetes Disease Management Program is to help diabetics and pre-diabetics to learn to manage the disease and improve their quality of life.

Exclusive Care professionals knowledgeable in diabetes disease management services conducted an industry search for professional services to assist in the development of a Diabetes Disease Management Program at Exclusive Care. The search identified The Joslin Diabetes Center, Inc. (Joslin), a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization affiliated with the Harvard Medical School. Joslin has an international reputation for treatment of diabetes, and has developed programs and materials designed to share their expertise with other organizations in the management of this deadly disease.

The Joslin approach is to divide the scope of work into two (2) phases. The first phase (approximately \$50,000 including out-of-pocket expenses) includes Joslin doing a complete assessment of the Exclusive Care program needs, and preparation of recommendations for the development of a state-of-the-art disease management program for diabetes. Phase II includes providing professional consulting services (approximately \$100,000) and various patient educational materials (approximately \$50,000) to assist Exclusive Care in fully developing a high quality diabetes disease management program for its members.

Justification

Diabetes is a progressive and destructive disease leading to death unless properly managed. People with diabetes are at an increased risk for developing heart disease, kidney failure, blindness, and amputation. A person with diabetes incurs medical costs that are estimated to be two to three times higher than that of a person without diabetes, but those costs can be reduced significantly through disease management. Studies also show that poorly controlled diabetes and its complications contribute to absenteeism and affect productivity on the job.

The Joslin Diabetes Center, Inc. services include program development for Exclusive Care’s Center of Excellence for Disease Management, co-branded diabetes educational materials, and an outreach program to improve diabetes care throughout Exclusive Care’s network of over 500 physicians. The Joslin Diabetes Center, Inc. also provides unique professional consultation, and educational services designed and proven effective in the establishment of a diabetes disease management program. To our knowledge, no other providers have a similar proven track record of consultative focus.

As part of its diabetes disease management program, Exclusive Care is also planning to develop protocols and training utilizing the Joslin Center’s approach to diabetes management which will be disseminated to its network physicians including those at the Community Health Agency (CHA) Family Health Centers and the Riverside County Regional Medical Center (RCRMC). Adoption of these protocols will improve diabetic care for the general population of the County in addition to the County employees. Development of a diabetes disease management program is supported by both CHA and RCRMC.

The level of care required to allow members with diabetes to thrive is not available within the general healthcare community as payors do not reimburse providers to give the level and types of care required for patients to effectively manage their diabetes. With over 600 members (6.2% of Exclusive Care’s enrolled membership) diagnosed with diabetes, it would appear that Exclusive Care’s membership has the same characteristics as the population as a whole. Studies further suggest that approximately one third of the general population (translates to 3,300 Exclusive Care members) either have diabetes or are at risk of developing the disease.

The Joslin Diabetes Center, Inc. has over 100 years of history and a quarter million treated patients with an international reputation as the foremost diabetes research, care and education center in the world. The Joslin Diabetes Center, Inc., has pioneered and continues to set the standards for much of today's specialty diabetes care. According to the *Benefits & Compensation Digest*, the average healthcare costs for a person with diabetes in 2005 was \$7,768. Based on this average cost and the costs that could be avoided with appropriate preventive care, the anticipated savings to Exclusive Care and its members would be approximately \$5,200 per diabetic per year or a total savings ranging from \$3.2 million to \$4.8 million annually.

The information below is provided in support of the Human Resources Department requesting approval for a sole source. Outside of a duly declared emergency, the time to develop a statement of work or specifications is not in itself justification for sole source.

Supply/Service being requested: Professional consultation and educational materials for the development and operation of a high quality disease management program addressing diabetes and its many related complications to treat members of the County's Exclusive Care EPO. Services include program development for Exclusive Care's Center of Excellence for Disease Management, co-branded diabetes educational materials, and development of an outreach program to improve diabetes care throughout Exclusive Care's network of over 500 physicians.

Supplier being requested: Joslin Diabetes Center, Inc., a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization affiliated with Harvard Medical School.

Alternative suppliers that can or might be able to provide supply/service: The Joslin Diabetes Center, Inc. provides unique professional consultation and educational services designed and proven in the establishment of a diabetes disease management program. To our knowledge, no other providers have a similar proven track record or consultative focus.

Extent of market search conducted: Exclusive Care professionals knowledgeable in diabetic disease management services conferred and conducted an industry search for professional services to assist in developing Exclusive Care's Diabetes Disease Management Program.

Unique features of the supply/service being requested from this supplier, which no alternative supplier can provide: Over 100 years of history and a quarter million treated patients with an international reputation as the foremost diabetes research, care, and education center in the world. Reasons why my department requires these unique features and what benefit will accrue to the county: Diabetes is a progressive and destructive disease leading to death unless properly managed. People with diabetes are at increased risk for developing heart disease, kidney failure, blindness, and amputation. Diabetes is reaching epidemic proportions throughout the US including Riverside County. According to a study published in the journal *Diabetes Care*, the prevalence of diagnosed diabetes rose from 5.1% in the period 1988-94 to 6.5% in the period 1999-2002. Researchers also report that there is an additional 2.8% of the population who have diabetes but are not diagnosed for a total of 9.3% of the population having diabetes. In addition, there is another 26% of adults who have fasting blood sugar levels above normal and are at risk for developing diabetes. The level of care required to allow members with diabetes to thrive is not available within the general healthcare community as payors don't reimburse providers to give the level and types of care required for patients to effectively manage their diabetes. With over 600 members (6.2% of Exclusive Care's enrolled membership) diagnosed with diabetes, it would appear that Exclusive Care's membership has the same characteristics as the population as a whole which, based on the study, suggests that over 3,300 of its members have diabetes or are at risk for developing the disease. To address the health care required to minimize the debilitating effects of this disease on its membership, Exclusive Care is developing a Center of Excellence to help these County employees and their family members manage this chronic disease and continue to be healthy and productive employees for the County while reducing the cost of healthcare. 

There is no impact on the County General Fund.
