SUBJECT: Ratify the agreements with Anka Behavioral Health, Inc. for the provision of services in support of the Mental Health Services Act.

RECOMMENDED MOTION: Move that the Board of Supervisors:

1. Ratify and execute the professional service agreements with Anka Behavioral Health, Inc. for five (5) years renewable in one-year increments; and
2. Authorize the Purchasing Agent to sign amendments and exercise the renewal options.

BACKGROUND:

On January 10, 2006, Agenda Item 3.71, the Board approved the Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) Community Services and Supports (CSS) Plan and on December 12, 2006, Agenda Item 3.26, the Board ratified the agreement with the State for implementation of the MHSA CSS Plan and authorized the Auditor-Controller to make the necessary budget adjustments. MHSA is a ballot measure passed by California voters in November 2004 that provides new funding for public mental health services. This funding

BACKGROUND (Continued)

provides for an expansion and transformation of public mental health system and expects to achieve results such as a reduction in incarcerations, school failures, unemployment and homelessness for individuals with severe mental illness.

The Comprehensive Integrated Services for Adults Work Plan of the MHSA CSS Plan calls for the establishment of new full service partnership programs within the Adult System of Care known as the Integrated Service and Recovery Centers. These services expand the capacity of existing (AB2034) wellness and recovery services. In addition to serving adults who are homeless or at risk of homelessness, services will be provided to frequent users of restrictive institutional treatment and/or who are in contact with the criminal justice system as a result of untreated or ineffectively treated mental illness including co-occurring disorders. Full Service Partnership will include integrated treatment of mental health and co-occurring substance abuse disorders. Consumers and family members will provide peer-to-peer outreach, support, family education and advocacy. In addition, there will be access 24 hours per day; educational, vocational and employment support; access to housing and other essential resources necessary to achieve the goals of recovery and resiliency.

County Purchasing issued RFP #MHARC011 seeking competitive proposals from qualified agencies to provide Integrated Service and Recovery Centers in the Desert and Mid-County Mental Health regional areas to service Transition Age Youth and/or Adults. The RFP was mailed to over forty organizations and posted on the County's website. Approximately eight individuals representing four potential contractors, and the Department of Mental Health attended the pre-bid conference. Four proposals were received by County Purchasing for the Adult population group with annual cost proposals ranging from \$1,230,552 to \$1,938,399 in the Desert region and \$1,809,809 to \$3,155,324 in the Mid-County region. An evaluation team was established and included representation from the Department of Mental Health, consumers of county mental health services and family members of consumers. The committee evaluated the four proposals and scored them based upon the criteria set forth in the RFP.

Anka Behavioral Health, Inc.'s proposal was selected as the most responsive and met the goals of the Department's request for the Desert and Mid-County regions. They were the lowest cost bidders for both regions.

PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE:

The contracts will be effective from July 1, 2007 through June 30, 2008 and will be eligible for renewal annually up to June 30, 2012 for an amount not greater than \$3,040,361 in aggregate for both the Desert and Mid-County regions.

No County funds are required.

JUSTIFICATION FOR DELAY

Subsequent to the close of the RFP, there was a period of proposal evaluation and contract negotiation.
