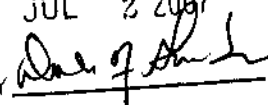

22 **WHEREAS**, the Report filed with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors states that the  
23 assessments to be levied in the respective Zones and Street Lighting Zones for fiscal year 2007-08  
24 are in an amount that is the same as levied in fiscal year 2006-07, increased by two percent (2%)  
25 more than the assessments levied for fiscal year 2006-07, or increased by three point eight percent  
26 (3.8%) more than the assessments levied in fiscal year 2006-07 (based on the cumulative percentage

1 increase in the CPI-U from March 2006 through March 2007), and are consistent with the terms of the  
2 ballot proposition approving the annexation of each zone; and

3 **WHEREAS**, it is necessary that the Board of Supervisors adopt a resolution of intention  
4 pursuant to Section 22624 of the Streets and Highways Code, which fixes and gives notice, pursuant
