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**RECOMMENDED MOTION: (CONTINUED)** That the Board of Supervisors:

- 5) Authorize Chairperson of the Board to sign five (5) copies of the Memorandum of Understanding number EIP 07-33/4 for Early Intervention Program; and
- 6) Authorize Chairperson of the Board to sign five (5) copies of the Memorandum of Understanding number SP 07-33/3 for HIV/AIDS Surveillance Program.

**BACKGROUND:**

The Department of Public Health, HIV/AIDS Program has received funds for HIV services from the California Department of Health Services since 1984. This Agreement will continue funding for HIV services through June 30, 2010. The following services will be funded:

- 1) HIV Testing and Counseling (MOU # HIV 07-33/2) funds provide staff and supplies for HIV testing and counseling at various locations throughout the County, including public health clinics, substance abuse treatment sites, HIV outreach sites, and community based organizations. The goal of the HIV testing and counseling program is to allow high risk individuals to learn their HIV status and enroll into medical care if infected.
- 2) AIDS Education and Prevention (MOU # PRE 07-33/1) funds provide staff and supplies for targeted outreach efforts to individuals at high risk for contracting HIV disease. Approximately 65% these funds are distributed to community providers via a request for proposal (RFP) process. The goal of the AIDS Education and Prevention is to reduce transmission of HIV.
- 3) Early Intervention Program (EIP) (MOU # EIP 07-33/4) funds provide staff and supplies for medical services for individuals living with HIV. EIP services include physical exams, laboratory testing and evaluations, psychosocial, health education and nutritional assessments and treatment. The goal of EIP is to lengthen life of people living with HIV and reduce transmission to non-infected individuals.
- 4) HIV/AIDS Surveillance Program (MOU # SP 07-33/3) funds provide staff and supplies to conduct Surveillance activities for HIV and AIDS case finding and reporting. HIV and AIDS are reportable diseases under California law. The goal of the HIV/AIDS Surveillance Program is to ensure that all cases of HIV and AIDS diagnosed in Riverside County are reported accurately in a timely fashion.
