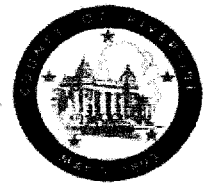

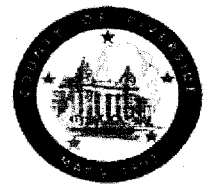

WHEREAS, government archival institutions provide the principal repositories for documents which record these government functions; and

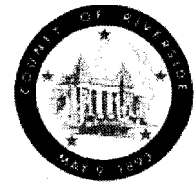
WHEREAS, the County of Riverside has embarked upon an archival program and anticipates opening a research facility in the very near future to provide information to both county officials and the public; and

BACKGROUND continued:

Motivated by the experience with the California Commission public hearings, the County of Riverside Commission for Women seeks to provide the women of Riverside County and those nonprofit agencies which provide services to them, an opportunity to voice their opinions about the diverse and unique issues facing them. Using the state hearings as a model, the County of Riverside Commission for Women seeks to hold its first public hearing on issues affecting women and girls in the county in June 2008.

Following this hearing, the Commission will provide the County of Riverside Board of Supervisors with comprehensive written findings regarding identified needs and recommendations for action to meet those needs. These hearings will provide valuable information to assist the Commission, and thus, the Board of Supervisors, in their on-going work to achieve improvement in the status of women and their families of Riverside County.

Therefore, consistent with the by-laws governing this commission, the County of Riverside Commission for Women seeks authorization from the Riverside County Board of Supervisors to conduct a public hearing in June 2008 for the purpose of learning about issues impacting the women of Riverside County so that the Commission may provide the Board of Supervisors with informed recommendations for policy and legislative action.

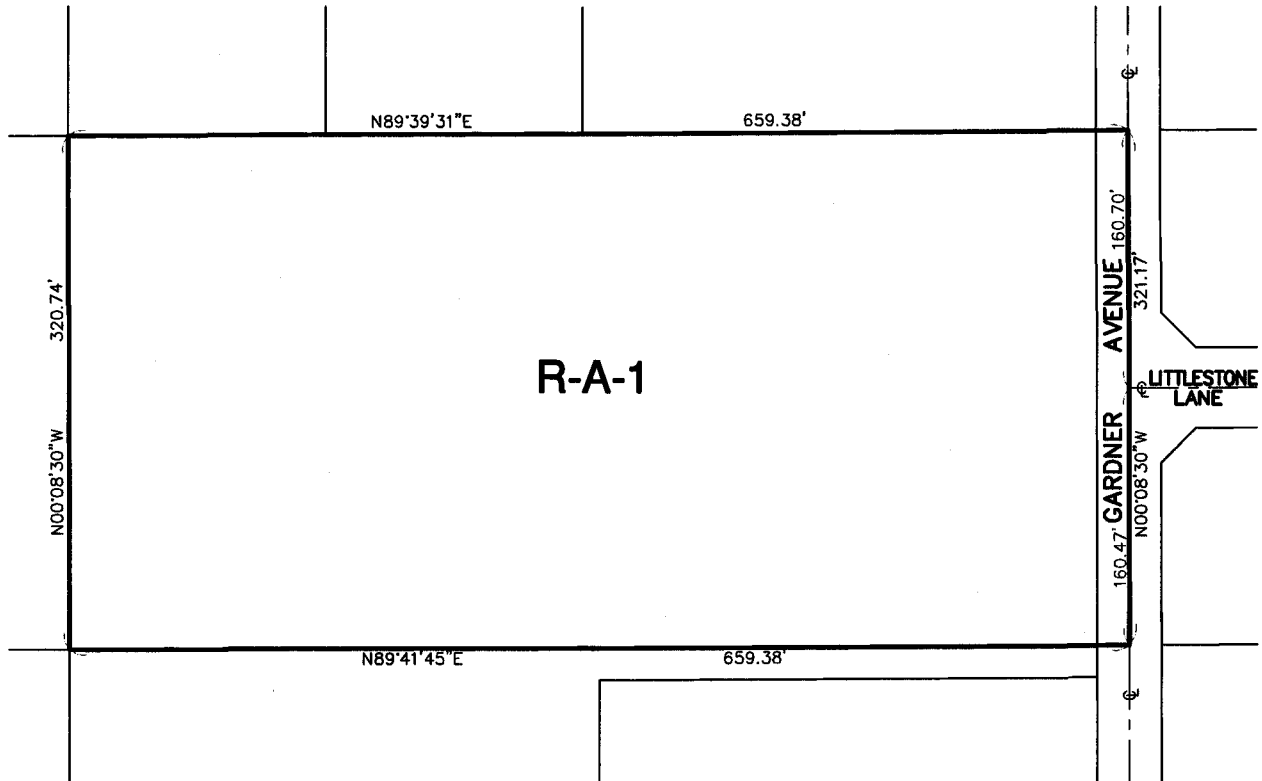

The above-captioned matter came on regularly for hearing on September 18, 2007, before the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside, State of California in the Board Room, First Floor Annex, County Administrative Center, 4080 Lemon Street, Riverside, California regarding the real property described as 21300 Gemini Road, Desert Hot Springs, Riverside County, and further described as Assessor's Parcel Number 647-170-020 referred to hereinafter as "THE PROPERTY."

Tiffany N. North, Deputy County Counsel, appeared along with Jim Monroe, Code Enforcement Division Manager, on behalf of the Director of the Code Enforcement Department.

No one appeared on behalf of the property owners.

The Board of Supervisors received the Declaration of the Code Enforcement Officer together with the attached exhibits, evidencing the accumulation of rubbish on THE PROPERTY as a public nuisance and violation of Riverside County Ordinance No. 541, as codified in Riverside County Code Chapter 8.120.

1 **SUMMARY OF EVIDENCE**

2 1. Documents of record in the Riverside County Recorder's Office identify the
3 OWNERS of THE PROPERTY as Bill J. Decker and Lois M. Decker ("OWNERS").

4 2. Documents of title indicate that other parties potentially hold a legal interest in THE
5 PROPERTY, to-wit: Farmers Home Administration, Bank of America NA, and Integrated Lender
6 Services ("INTERESTED PARTIES").

7 3. THE PROPERTY was inspected by Code Enforcement Officers on November 15,
8 2006, January 23, 2007, March 26, 2007, May 2, 2007, August 13, 2007 and September 17, 2007.

9 4. During each inspection, an accumulation of rubbish was observed on THE
10 PROPERTY. The rubbish consisted of, but was not limited to: broken furniture, wooden debris,
11 deteriorated carpet, plastic buckets, concrete blocks, broken televisions, trash cans, used truck parts,
12 deteriorated mattresses, scrap metal, a propane tank, a hose, paint buckets, broken tile, defective
13 fans, and other miscellaneous deteriorated items. The accumulated rubbish on THE PROPERTY
14 was estimated to be approximately seventeen thousand three hundred sixty (17,360) square feet.

15 5. THE PROPERTY was determined to be in violation of Riverside County Ordinance
16 No. 541 (RCC Chapter 8.120) by the Code Enforcement Officer.

17 6. A Notice of Noncompliance was recorded in the Office of the County Recorder,
18 County of Riverside, State of California on March 29, 2007 as instrument number 2007-0212660.

19 7. On November 15, 2006, a Notice of Violation was posted on THE PROPERTY. On
20 November 29, 2006 and March 26, 2007, Notices of Violation were mailed by certified mail, return
21 receipt requested to OWNERS and INTERESTED PARTIES.

22 8. On August 9, 2007, a "Notice To Correct Violation and Abate Public Nuisance"
23 providing notice of the public hearing before the Board of Supervisors on September 18, 2007 was
24 mailed by certified mail, return receipt requested, to the OWNERS and INTERESTED PARTIES
25 and posted on THE PROPERTY on August 13, 2007.

26 **FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS**

27 WHEREFORE, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside, State of California, in
28 regular session assembled on September 18, 2007 finds and concludes that:

1 County Ordinance Nos. 541 and 725. Under Riverside County Ordinance No. 725, "abatement
2 costs" means "any costs or expenses reasonably related to the abatement of conditions which violate
3 County Land Use Ordinances, and shall include, but not be limited to, enforcement, investigation,
4 collection and administrative costs, attorneys fees, and the costs associated with the removal or
5 correction of the violation." Reasonable abatement costs accrued by the Code Enforcement
6 Department will be recoverable from the property owner(s) even if THE PROPERTY is brought into
7 compliance within ninety (90) days of the date of this Order to Abate Nuisance.
