SUBJECT: Fifth District Use of Community Improvement Designation Funds for Signing the Armed Forces Freeway

RECOMMENDED MOTION:

That the Board of Supervisors:

1. Approve the use of Fifth District Community Improvement Designation Funds to Caltrans for placing signs on I-215 naming it the Armed Forces Freeway;
2. Approve and direct the Auditor-Controller to make the following budget adjustments:

BACKGROUND: Board Minute Order 3.48, on December 12, 2006, directed the Transportation and Land Management Agency to make application on behalf of the County of Riverside to designate a portion of the Interstate 215 Freeway between the I-215/SR-60 Interchange in Moreno Valley and Riverside, south to the I-215/SR-74 off ramp in Perris, the Veterans Memorial Freeway.

At about the same time, the City of Riverside's Military Heritage Committee approached Assemblyman John Benoit requesting his assistance to sponsor legislation renaming the above referenced portion of I-215 as the Armed Forces Freeway. Assemblyman Benoit's ARC 22 has been signed into law. Caltrans has now requested payment of \$3,571.08, for the placement of two freeway signs with the new name "Armed Forces Freeway". Fifth District Community Improvement Designation funds will pay for one-half of the cost of the freeway signs.
