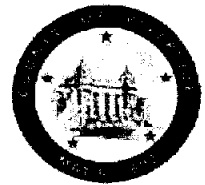

SUBJECT: Approve the Contract with Universal Health Services of Rancho Springs, Inc. d.b.a. Southwest Healthcare System – Inland Valley Medical Center (IVMC) for the provision of Level III Trauma Center Services.

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1) Approve the contract with Inland Valley Medical Center, from July 1, 2007 through June 30, 2012; and
- 2) Authorize the Chairperson to execute four (4) copies of the contract.

BACKGROUND: The revised Riverside County EMS Agency Trauma Plan was approved by the board of Supervisors on August 28, 2001 and by the State EMS Authority on October 25, 2002. Title 22 of the California Code of Regulations, Division 9, Section 100255(g) required that there be written agreements between the local EMS Agency and the individual trauma centers.
