BACKGROUND:

On May 16, 2006, through the 2006 Continuum of Care Consolidated Application to HUD, the Board requested funding to support a 1-year renewal grant to continue to operate the Homeless Management Information System throughout Riverside County.

This web-based HMIS system allows the County to more effectively assess homeless needs, allocate resources, and coordinate services through its enhanced tracking and reporting capabilities.

Currently, there are ninety (90) licensed users, representing approximately twenty-one (21) local agencies, using HMIS county-wide.

HUD executed the attached Supportive Housing Grant Agreement on September 13, 2007, which we are forwarding to your Board for approval.

FINANCIAL DATA:

The County's financial requirement is a 20% cash match (\$62,024) for HMIS funding only. There is no match requirement for Administration.
