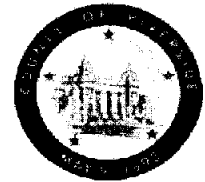

SUBJECT: California Department of Public Health MCAH Title V Riverside County Allocation for 07/08

RECOMMENDED MOTION:

That the Board of Supervisors approves the California Department of Public Health Title V allocation award of \$9,450 for Fiscal year 2007-08.

BACKGROUND: The California Department of Public Health is contracting with Dr. Ira Chasnoff of The National Training Institute to provide a report on perinatal substance use screening data in California. California Department of Public Health, Maternal Child and Adolescent Health (MCAH) are allocating \$9,450.00 in Title V funding for FY 2007-08 to fund the project.

The Perinatal Substance Abuse Screening, Assessment, Referral and Treatment Program (Perinatal SART) seeks to address the impact of alcohol, tobacco and other drug use during pregnancy and the benefits of early intervention.

BACKGROUND Continued:

Data from the Perinatal Substance Abuse SART Program reveals an estimated 14% of pregnant women screen positive for the use of one or more substances during pregnancy. In 2005, there were 31,509 births, applying this 14% rate (which is considered a low estimate), 4411 babies were born exposed to alcohol and/or other drugs in Riverside County.

**CHASNOFF PERINATAL SUBSTANCE USE REPORT, SCOPE OF WORK (SOW)
FISCAL YEAR (FY) 2007-08 MCAH ALLOCATION ADJUSTMENT**

As you have discussed with Dr. Ramstrom, Dr. Chasnoff will be providing a comprehensive report on perinatal substance use screening data in California through Riverside County. 
