BACKGROUND:

Since 2001, Community Action Partnership of Riverside County (CAP Riverside), with the direction of the Community Action Commission and its Energy Task Force has operated the Summer Crisis Cool Center Program.

Cool Centers are a unique approach to preventive health in that they are safe cool places for individuals, especially those most vulnerable populations, to escape the high temperatures during the summer months.

The program is a collaborative effort primarily supported by community partners throughout Riverside County who provide space, staff, volunteers and educational materials as in-kind donations.

In 2007, CAP Riverside partnered with 42 community and faith-based organizations to operate Cool Centers throughout Riverside County. These organizations provided a cool safe center to over 11,000 individuals and donated approximately \$1 million in in-kind services and materials.

Therefore, the Executive Director of CAP Riverside requests that the Board recognize and present the Certificates of Appreciation by Governor Schwarzenegger to the Partners of CAP Riverside Cool Center Program.
