SUBJECT: Graffiti Abatement Services Agreement

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Directors approve and authorize the Chairman to execute the First Amendment to the Graffiti Abatement Services Agreement by and between the Redevelopment Agency for the County of Riverside and Inland Tri-Tech, Inc. for supplemental graffiti abatement services.

BACKGROUND:

In October 2006, EDA launched the newly expanded graffiti abatement program for Riverside County with the purchase of two state-of-the-art vehicles equipped with paint matching technology, and two staff members to operate each vehicle. With the new vehicles, and contracts with Inland Tri Tech, Valley Wide Recreation and Park District, Jurupa Community Services District, and Crowson Management, all unincorporated communities of Riverside County are being served.

BACKGROUND (Continued):

As graffiti became more prevalent throughout all regions of Riverside County, it became evident that EDA needed to expand the program in order to keep up with the growing demand. EDA has since purchased two additional vehicles, one will provide services to Western Riverside, primarily in the Second District and the other will serve the Fourth District and portions of the Fifth District. Both trucks are currently being manufactured. EDA currently manages two full time in-house crews and one full time crew through Inland Tri Tech throughout the western portion of Riverside County.

EDA has managed the contract with Inland Tri Tech for many years. During the implementation of the new program it was anticipated that Inland Tri Tech would still remain on board to supplement the new program. For the first year of the program Inland Tri Tech has provided staff who primarily service the Second District and offer four wheel drive capabilities in rural areas of Riverside County. As the program has become more well known, the demand for graffiti removal services has grown and it is recommended that the contract with Inland Tri Tech be extended for another year to address the high demand for this service. The contract will allow the program to maintain current levels of service.
