SUBJECT: Date Palm Drive/Interstate 10 Interchange Mitigation Agreement

RECOMMENDED MOTION:

APPROVE the Date Palm Drive Interstate 10 Interchange Mitigation Agreement

BACKGROUND:

The Date Palm Drive/Interstate 10 (I-10) interchange is one of five Coachella Valley I-10 interchanges and associated arterials included in the Interstate 10 Conservation Plan. The other interchanges are Palm Drive/Gene Autry Trail, Indian Avenue, Bob Hope Drive and Jefferson Avenue. The Interstate 10 Conservation Plan was negotiated by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), California Department of Transportation (Caltrans), Coachella Valley Association of Governments (CVAG) and the local sponsoring agencies to mitigate for the impacts of these facilities on the Coachella Valley fringe-toed lizard and the Coachella Valley milk-vetch, two federally listed endangered species. The mitigation obligation is to purchase

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and manage 473.72 acres. The land has been purchased by CVAG. The County of Riverside's obligation under this agreement is to authorize CVAG to assist in satisfying the mitigation requirement.

The County of Riverside's cost share of the purchase will be covered by a separate agreement with CVAG that includes all interchange costs. Generally, cost are shared on a 75% CVAG/25% local agency basis with local agencies, the County and cities, share of the 25% determined by the benefit derived from the facility.
