
SUBJECT: County Service Area 70 and 124

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board approve Resolution No. 2008-101 Dissolution of County Service Areas 70 and 124 Advisory Boards

BACKGROUND: Municipal Advisory Councils (MAC) have been established in many unincorporated communities in Riverside County, and have been very successful in providing input to the Board of Supervisors on matters of concern to the residents.

County Service Area (CSA) CSA 70 provides Street Lighting and CSA 124 provides road services. Until creation of the Perris Valley MAC the Advisory Boards were the only meeting forum for residents of the Perris Valley community. As a result, CSAs 70 and 124 Advisory Boards were often asked by residents to intervene on a variety of public issues, such as planning, code enforcement complaints, graffiti, and law enforcement, etc. It is more appropriate that the current Advisory Boards be dissolved and the community be represented by the Perris Valley MAC that was created by the board on July 31, 2007. CSA 41 will not be dissolved and will continue to provide a forum for residents of the Good Hope/Meadowbrook area. This is due to requests made to LAFCO regarding annexation and sphere of influence changes requested by the City of Canyon Lake. Dissolution will occur at the appropriate time after these issues have been resolved.

5 **DISSOLUTION OF COUNTY SERVICE AREAS 70 and 124 ADVISORY BOARD**

6 **WHEREAS**, on June, 18, 1985, the Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution No. 85-313
7 Establishing an Advisory Committee for County Service Area No. 70; and

8 **WHEREAS**, on February 24, 1981, the Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution No. 81-
9 60 Establishing an Advisory Committee for County Service Area 124; and

10 **WHEREAS**, on November 7, 2006, the Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution No.
11 2005-148, Adopting Uniform Rules and Procedures for Advisory Committees, Boards and
12 Commissions of the County of Riverside which states that the Board of Supervisors may, at any
13 time and in its sole discretion, dissolve the advisory group by resolution; and

14 **WHEREAS**, Government Code Section 31010 and Riverside County Board Policy No.
15 A-51 provides for the creation of a Municipal Advisory Council within unincorporated territory
16 for the purpose of advising the Board of Supervisors on matters including, but not limited to,
17 public safety, planning, health, transportation, parks and community development; and

18 **WHEREAS**, on July 31, 2007, the Board of Supervisors approved Resolution 2007-395
19 Creating the Perris Valley Municipal Advisory Council; and

20 **WHEREAS**, the Perris Valley Municipal Advisory Council will be tasked with the
21 additional duties to advise on road issues.

22 **NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, DETERMINED AND ORDERED** by the
23 Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside, State of California, in regular session
24 assembled on April 29, 2008 that the County Service Area 70, and 124 Advisory Boards be
25 dissolved and all incumbent advisory board members be removed.
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
