SUBJECT: Approval of the Agreement between the California Environmental Protection Agency (Cal/EPA) and the Riverside County Department of Environmental Health Certified Unified Program Agency (Riverside County CUPA) for the Aboveground Petroleum Storage Act Program; Riverside County Board of Supervisors Resolution No. 2008-214 authorizing the grant Agreement.

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1) Approve the grant Agreement between Cal/EPA and the Riverside County CUPA for the period of January 1, 2008 through March 1, 2010, in the amount of \$105,784.67;
- 2) Approve Resolution No. 2008-214, authorizing the Riverside County Department of Environmental Health Certified Unified Program Agency to Enter into an Agreement with the State of California Environmental Protection Agency and Designating a Representative to Sign the Agreement and Any Amendments thereto for Implementation of the Aboveground Petroleum Storage Tank Act; and
- 3) Authorize the Environmental Health Director to sign the Agreement on behalf of the County, in accordance with Resolution No. 2008-214.

BACKGROUND: The Riverside County CUPA is to receive funding from Cal/EPA to implement the requirements of the Aboveground Petroleum Storage Tank Act (APSA). These funds will be utilized for existing Environmental Health staff to incorporate the APSA Program into the existing Unified Program structure established for Riverside County. Implementation activities will relate to the fee accountability program, single fee system, staffing plan, identification of regulatory universe, staff training, inspection and compliance plan, administrative procedures, and regulated business outreach.

A portion of these funds will also be used by two of our Participating Agencies (City of Riverside and City of Corona) to incorporate the implementation of the new APSA Program. Once Cal/EPA receives Riverside County CUPA's signed grant Agreement and Resolution, Cal/EPA will disburse the initial advance allocation of 80 percent of the total sum of \$105,784.67. The remaining 20 percent will be available on a reimbursement basis after the initial 80 percent has been expended. The remaining grant fund balance will be carried over to the next fiscal year and will be exhausted by December 31, 2009.

11 WHEREAS the Riverside County Department of Environmental Health Certified Unified Program
12 Agency (Riverside County CUPA) submitted a grant application to the California Environmental
13 Protection Agency (Cal/EPA) to receive funding for implementation of the Aboveground Petroleum
14 Storage Act; and

15 WHEREAS Cal/EPA has approved Riverside County CUPA's grant application in the amount of
16 One Hundred Five Thousand Seven Hundred Eighty-Four Dollars and Sixty Seven Cents (\$105, 784.67)
17 (grant funds); and

18 WHEREAS the Riverside County CUPA shall use these grant funds made available pursuant to
19 the California Health and Safety Code, section 25270.11, and per the grant Agreement, and any
20 amendment, with Cal/EPA to implement the requirements of the Aboveground Storage Tank Act.

21 THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside, State
22 of California, in regular session assembled on May 20, 2008, has authorized the Director of the Riverside
23 County Department of Environmental Health or designee, to execute and amend the grant Agreement
24 with Cal/EPA.
