BACKGROUND (Cont'd):

Foster Care Month originated in 1988 when the National Foster Parent Association advocated for an annual proclamation which was issued by President George H. Bush. The main focus was to provide appreciation and recognition for the tremendous efforts and contributions of foster parents across the nation.

In Riverside County there are currently 552 licensed foster care homes, 1073 relative and non-relative extended family members (NREFM), 864 foster family agency homes and 58 group home organizations serving over 5,000 children. These homes provide safe, stable and nurturing environments to children until they can be reunited with their biological parents or placed in a permanent home. With guidance from supportive adults, foster children do overcome the trauma of previous abuse and neglect. Without these permanent connections, former foster children are far more likely to endure homelessness, poverty, compromised health, unemployment, incarceration and other adversities after they leave the foster care system.

Foster care families are helping to build a brighter future for the children and youth they serve. By proclaiming May 2008 to be Foster Care Month in the County of Riverside, the Board of Supervisors continues a tradition of commitment and support for extraordinary efforts of foster care families serving the communities in our county. This recognition is to take place during the same month that the State of California and the Federal Government also recognize the foster care community.

WHEREAS, in Riverside County there are 5000 children and youth in foster care being provided with a safe, secure and stable home along with the compassion and nurture of a foster family, and

WHEREAS, all young people in foster care need a meaningful connection to a caring adult who becomes a supportive and lasting presence in their lives, and

WHEREAS, foster, kinship and adoptive families, who open their homes and hearts and support children whose families are in crisis, play a vital role in helping children and families heal and reconnect, thereby assisting young people transition successfully into adulthood, and

WHEREAS, dedicated foster families frequently adopt foster children, resulting in a greater need for more foster families, and

WHEREAS, there are numerous individuals, public and private organizations who work to increase public awareness of the needs of children in and leaving foster care, and

WHEREAS the enduring and valuable contribution of foster parents, and the foster care "system" is only as good as those who choose to be part of it;

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE KNOWN THAT, THE RIVERSIDE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, do hereby proclaim May as FOSTER CARE MONTH and urge all citizens to serve an active role in making a difference in the lives of children and youth in foster care.
