Both were highly contested and one (the Mira Loma effort), was formed as the result of unhappiness and tension with the Jurupa effort. In the end, due in big part to the tensions and controversy shadowing the efforts, both failed miserably.

Eastvale and Jurupa Incorporation Committees  
July 29, 2008**

Now nearly 20 years later, two new efforts have begun which ultimately may lead to the successful approval of two new cities; "Eastvale" a new burgeoning community developed over the past 10 years west of the I-15 north of the Santa Ana River; and "Jurupa Valley" a well-established older community with mixer of rural, semi-rural, and suburban-oriented communities (Mira Loma, Glen Avon, Pedley, Jurupa Hills/Indian Hills, Rubidoux & Sunnyslope). It is currently roughly-estimated that approximately 175,000 people reside within the two areas – 110,000 in Jurupa & 65,000 in Eastvale.

The Eastvale Incorporation Committee formed approximately one (1) year ago and is well on its way in their efforts to incorporation nearing the end of their signature drive, recently completing their preliminary fiscal analysis and currently conducting the comprehensive fiscal analysis.

The Jurupa Incorporation Committee initially had some rough starts and organization challenges but through focused community leadership they recently achieved their non-profit (501c3) designation and has elected officers to their committee. They are now ready to begin their preliminary fiscal analysis followed by a signature gathering effort and subsequent application to LAFCO.

Recognizing that the two neighboring cityhood efforts are well-organized and underway and in my attempt to insure both work as closely together as possible in order to avoid the challenges and ultimate failure of the two efforts of the late 80's and early 90's, my office has decided to help them through the process. Most importantly, we want to insure that both efforts have very detailed and up-to-date fiscal information and continue to work closely together in the most challenging aspects of the process – establishing each potential city's boundary options so that in the end both cities, if successful in their efforts, achieve a strong chance of prosperity and become good neighbors.

The most critical aspect to the success of any cityhood effort lies in the quality and accuracy of the fiscal analysis. Such analysis is expensive and has historically been paid through committee fundraising efforts. Unfortunately, with the extreme downturn in the economy, such fundraising efforts have been minimal at best. It is for this reason, and for the sole purpose of assuring the success of both cities and their unity, that I feel it appropriate to help with the necessary funding. However, both must still insure their signature drives are successful, and so doing, must work diligently to gain the support of their respective communities.
