**RECOMMENDED MOTION:** Move that:

- (1) The grading without permits on the real property located at One Parcel East of 23449 Casa Bonita Avenue, Canyon Lake, Riverside County, California, APN: 351-102-019, be declared a public nuisance and a violation of Riverside County Ordinance No. 457 which does not permit grading of more than fifty (50) cubic yards without a grading permit.
- (2) That a five (5) year hold on the issuance of building permits and land use approvals be placed on The Property.

- (3) Mark S. Pellerin, Sonja M. Pellerin, Jason F. Pellerin and Christine M. Pellerin, the owners of the subject real property or whoever has possession or control of the premises, be directed to restore or remediate the unpermitted grading in accordance with all County Ordinances, including Ordinance No. 457, within ninety (90) days.
- (4) If the owners or whoever has possession or control of the real property do not take the above described action within ninety (90) days of the date of the mailing and posting of the Board's Order to Abate, that representatives of the Code Enforcement Department, are authorized to obtain the services of a contractor, upon consent of the owner or receipt of a Court Order authorizing entry onto the real property when necessary under applicable law, to restore the property so as to prevent offsite drainage and slope erosion.
- (5) The reasonable costs of abatement, after notice and an opportunity for hearing, shall be imposed as a lien on the real property, which may be collected as a special assessment against the real property pursuant to Government Code Section 25845 and Ordinance No. 725.
- (6) That upon the restoration of the property and payment of all abatement costs assessed against the property are paid the five (5) year hold on the issuance of building permits and land use approvals will be lifted.
- (7) County Counsel be directed to prepare the necessary Findings of Facts and Conclusions that the substandard structure on the real property is declared to be in violation of Riverside County Ordinance No. 457 and a public nuisance, and further, to prepare an Order to Abate for approval by the Board.

**JUSTIFICATION:**

1. An inspection was made of the subject property by the Code Enforcement Officer on August 16, 2007. The inspection revealed fill dirt had been brought onto the property. The dumped dirt deviated from the natural topography in violation of Riverside County Ordinance No. 457 (RCC Title 15). The officer estimates that approximately one hundred (100) cubic yards of dirt has been graded/filled on the property. A search of Riverside County records indicates that no permit for grading has been applied for or obtained. This creates a public and attractive nuisance.
2. Follow-up inspections on February 26, 2008, May 20, 2008, and June 24, 2008 revealed that the property continues to be in violation of Riverside County Ordinance No. 457.
3. Staff and the Code Enforcement Department have complied with the notice requirements set forth in the appropriate laws of this jurisdiction pertaining to the administrative abatement proceedings for grading without permits.
