**SUBJECT:** Memorandum of Agreement and Joint Use Agreement for the Riverside Community College Aquatics Complex.

**RECOMMENDED MOTION:** That the Board of Supervisors approve the attached Memorandum of Agreement and Joint Use Agreement between the County of Riverside, the City of Riverside, the Riverside Community College District and the Riverside Community College Foundation for the design, construction and operation of the new Aquatics Complex at Riverside Community College.

**BACKGROUND:** The Riverside Community College District (District), Riverside Community College Foundation (Foundation), the City of Riverside (City) and the County of Riverside (County) have conceptually agreed to jointly fund the development of a new aquatics complex at the District's Riverside campus. The project will include a 65 meter competitive pool and is designed to accommodate the needs of RCC and the community. The facility will be capable of handling competitive swim meets, dive meets, competitive synchronized swimming and water polo tournaments. Supervisor Buster and Supervisor Tavaglione have both agreed to assist in the funding of this facility and for the past three years have designated CID funds for that purpose. The attached Memorandum of Agreement explains the funding, design and construction of the facility. The Joint Use Agreement establishes how the facility will be made available to the students and the community. Participation in the funding provides the County the ability to schedule use of the facility for community events or aquatic events. The facility will be lighted and will include bleachers for up to 800 spectators, locker rooms and restrooms. It will be constructed on District-owned land adjacent to the existing two pools at the Cutter swimming complex. The existing pools will remain in place and will serve as additional space for training, classes and other uses. The total anticipated cost of the project is \$14 million. The District is providing \$5 million, the City is providing \$3 million, the County is providing \$1.75 million and the Foundation is raising the remaining \$4.3 million through a fund-raising initiative.
