

**SUBJECT:** Re-naming the Woodcrest Library the "Bob Buster Community Library"

**RECOMMENDED MOTION:** That the Board re-name the new Woodcrest Library the "Bob Buster Community Library"

**BACKGROUND:** The new Woodcrest Library, the first green building built by Riverside County, opened to the public on November 10, 2007. From the start of the design process, Supervisor Buster was committed to making this library a model of energy efficiency and sustainability, as well as a beautiful structure that would blend into the Woodcrest community. The resulting 10,000 square foot library meets the criteria for LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) Certification and the library has received the Green Building Council's Award of Excellence and the American Institute of Architects Chapter Merit Award. The Woodcrest community has embraced the new library with a doubling of circulation and a three-fold increase in library visits, making it one of the busiest libraries in the county library system.

In honor of Supervisor Buster's long career of dedicated public service, including fifteen years as Riverside County's First District Supervisor and service on an array of boards and commissions on behalf of the county, and in recognition of his determination to set the standard for sustainable architecture in Riverside County and provide a quality library facility for the Woodcrest community, it is most appropriate that this library bear the name of Bob Buster.
