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BACKGROUND:

On July 24, 2007 the Board of Supervisors approved a contract with Michael Brandman Associates (MBA) (Minute Order 3.59, July 24, 2007) to support the PSEC project's environmental regulatory compliance requirements. PSEC has recently learned that key MBA staff members have joined another consulting firm, PBS&J. In order to maintain continuity in the environmental process for the PSEC project, staff recommends that the county enter into a new contract with PBS&J for ongoing consulting services. The new contract will be similar to the MBA contract in fees and scope, but will contain additional tasks to conduct comprehensive environmental review for sites not previously analyzed, most of which are on federal lands.

County Counsel has reviewed and approved this Professional Services Agreement as to legal form.

FINANCIAL DATA:

Sufficient funds are available in the project budget to cover all costs associated with this agreement. Thus, no additional Net County Cost will be incurred as a result of this agreement.
